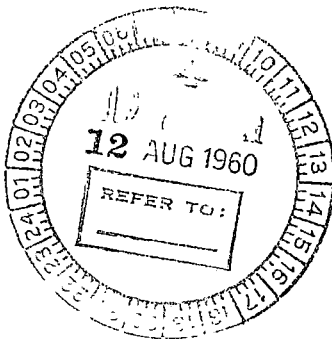

- Crown: - Design and colour in accordance with Annex to CAO 64-5
- Crowned Lion - Gold
- Scrolls - Red with gold edging
- Lettering - Gold
- Embroidery - metallic wire and coloured thread
- Background - navy blue to match the blazer
- Dimensions of C Pro C Badge - Height 3 inches
Width 2 5/8 inches

1. It is proposed to reproduce in colour the various corps and regimental badges for use as crests.

1 A request has been received from Stanley A. Grant, Limited, for the description and colours of blazer crests for all corps of the Canadian Army.

2 It is proposed to consolidate and forward this information to Stanley A. Grant, unless, as it is a corps matter, you would prefer to forward this information direct.

3 The following information with respect to the blazer crest for the Canadian Provost Corps is required:

- (a) confirmation that the design at flyleaf is correct;
- (b) colours to be used in the crest as well as the background on which it is mounted;
- (c) type of embroidery (metallic or silk);
- (d) the height and width in which the blazer crest should be manufactured.

Royal Canadian Signal Corps.

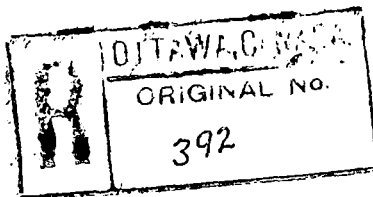
We have had numerous requests to supply these crests but

Reference is made to your letter of
6 February, 1954, with regard to embroidered blazer crests.

The design of the Royal Crest was altered
when the St Edward's Crown was introduced in 1952, (print of
Royal Crest attached), and for this reason a new design for
the badge of the Canadian Provost Corps is being developed.

A comparison of the new design of the Royal
Crest with the sample submitted is as follows:-

- (a) the centre jewel on the band of the Crown
should be sapphire;
- (b) the Crown on the lion's head is too small,
(see Crown on attached print);
- (c) the height of the cross pattee, in the
centre of the Crown, should equal the width.

The sample blazer crest is returned herewith,
and a drawing of the new badge will be forwarded when available.

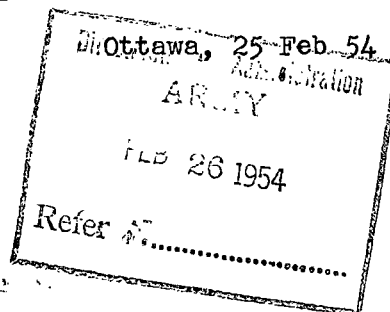

Dress - Blazer Crest
The Canadian Provost Corps



1 Herewith is a sample blazer crest for the Canadian Provost Corps which has been submitted by DuCharme Crests, Montreal, Quebec, for approval.

2 Comments with respect to the design of the crest are as follows:

- (a) the centre jewel on the band of the Crown should be a sapphire,
- (b) the height of the cross pattee, in the centre of the Crown, should equal the width,
- (c) the Crown on the lion's head is too small, (see sketch attached at flyleaf).

3 Your comments and recommendations with respect to the suitability of this crest are requested, please.

The attached sample crest is the most
horrible example of thread work I have
yet seen. Under no circumstances would
it be acceptable even with the improvements
suggested in a b & c.
The balance is bad and the colours
and detail are worse. The forelegs of the
lion should be separated by more than a
black thread. In general the appearance of the
lion approximates the cowardly lion in the
"Wizard of Oz".
