Reference is made to your letter of February 7th concerning the above two estates, namely Aleck PETER who died August 5, 1956, and his wife Christine PETER who died August 22, 1956. All the assets in the estate of Aleck Peter would have passed to his widow Christine Peter, and therefore the grandson, Leonard ANTOINE, shown as an heir to the estate of Aleck Peter, is not an heir to the estate of Christine Peter, Christine Peter being the second wife of Aleck Peter.

The land interest in the estate of Aleck Peter indicate a new house, frame construction, an old house, frame construction, and land on Malahat Indian Reserve. The two homesites are on the one piece of land indicated, the total acreage being approximately three acres. The other part of these three acres is across the road, which land was given to Archie HARRY, by Aleck PETER before his death, which is our understanding. On discussing this with the Council and checking with others, we find that the closest relatives are first cousins and that Christine Peter had no brothers or sisters nor did she have any children, her only relatives being two or three first cousins.

The Band Council Resolution of January 21, 1960, allotting lands to Aleck PETER estate, which has been approved and is now an asset in Christine PETER's estate, will all be reverting to Band land. There was apparent claim to a piece of wild timber land, however, upon discussion with the Band Council they advised that all timber lands were considered to be band property and not for individual allotment unless an individual made improvements or resided thereon, and only that piece of property would then be given consideration. From the above, it would then appear that Leonard ANTOINE, who is considered the grandson and heir to these two estates, received from Aleck PETER estate \$32.06 by cheque, \$12.53 by Agency funds held here and the tools and effects of the deceased, and also from the estate of Christine PETER the amount of \$55.00 by cheque and the clothing and personal belongings of the deceased.

We will await your further instructions towards the conclusion of this estate.

We refer to your letter dated March 1, 1960, and to our letters dated October 20, 1958, and March 30, 1960, concerning the above estate.

The point at issue here is that on the death of Aleck Peter on August 5, 1956, his entire estate passed to his widow, Christine Peter who died on August 22, 1956.

Therefore the property on the Malahat I. R. No. 11 which was allotted to the estate of Aleck Peter by B.C.R. dated January 26, 1960, which has been approved, is now an asset in the estate of Christine Peter and will pass to her heirs.

In the Application for Administration for her estate you showed Leonard Antoine, a grandson, as sole heir although on the basis of the information which you have given us he would not be an heir of Christine Peter's estate.

It would also appear that the 4 grandchildren shown in your letter of March 1, 1960, are not heirs of the estate of Christine Peter.

Would you please let us know who are the heirs of her estate.

We wish to refer to our letter of September 26, 1956, enclosing the application for appointment of Administrator in the estate of Aleck PETER, #1 of the Malahat Band. It is noted that the closest living heir was a grandson, Leonard ANTOINE, of the Cowichan Band. We wish to advise that it has now come to light that there are other grandsons involved in this estate, particularly Ernest RICE, Johnnie RICE and Willie RICE, all three being non-Indians, and Mrs. Harold WILLIAMS who we understand is a registered Indian on a Reserve at Ladner, B. C. All four are over the age of 21.

These four people are the children of Annie PETERS, who was legally married to George RICE, a non-Indian. Annie PETER, we understand, was the only child of Aleck PETER and his first wife.

The assets distributed to date were to pay off the debts of the Estate, and the remainder was passed on to Leonard ANTOINE. The Malahat Band are now prepared to pay an amount of \$300.00 to buy out the improvements on the land of Aleck PETER, and we would wish your advice in what manner to proceed at this point.

Further to your letter dated September 26, 1956, relative to the estates of Aleck & Christine Peter, we would advise that the following actions have now been taken: a cheque in the amount of \$32.06 is going forward payable to the Leonard Antoine, the next of kin, an heir at law in these two estates. Two further cheques are going forward also to retire the outstanding debts, namely, Bayview Store, Cobble Hill, \$8.86, and Mill Bay Garage & Store, Cobble Hill, B.C., \$14.08.

We would request that you turn over to Leonard Antoine \$12.53 by an agency cheque held in the form of cash at your agency office. These actions outlined above will dispose of the cash assets in this estate, personal effects being clothing and household effects to the amount of \$100.00 and \$25.00 worth of carpentry tools are also to be turned over to Leonard.
