Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge your letter of the 23rd instant submitting a letter from Mr A.B. Buckworth of Ymir B.C. in which he asks if a quarantine officer of the British Columbia staff vaccinates a person and gives him a protection card, which card is taken up at the boundary line by the assistant quarantine officer, and immediately after the person is vaccinated, and the doctor who has performed the act leaves the railroad car, the person who has just been vaccinated takes the bandage off his arm and rubs out the vaccine virus, in the presence of the Assistant Quarantine officer, has the assistant officer a right, as soon as the train reaches British territory, to insist upon the person leaving the train, and if he refuses, has the assistant the right to call upon the conductor to assist him in ejecting him from the train, so as to prevent him entering British territory, and in case the conductor is an alien, does it prevent him from assisting, or if called upon, is it compulsory for him to act ?

I have examined the Quarantine Act and the regulations which you submit with your letter, and I can only find that under Section 2 of the Quarantine Act the Governor in Council may from time to time make <sup>such</sup> regulations as he thinks proper for enforcing compliance with the requirements of the Act..... and concerning the arrival at or departure from any place in Canada of any persons, goods or things conveyed by land - and for ensuring the due performance of quarantine by and in respect of such persons, goods and things at or in the neighbourhood of any place in Canada to which he thinks it right for the preservation of the public health that such regulation



should apply - and for the thorough cleansing and disinfection of such persons goods and things so as to prevent as far as possible the introduction into or dissemination of disease in Canada. This clause of the Act does not therefore apparently contemplate any regulation making vaccination compulsory, and I cannot find anything in the regulations that you submit that pretends to make vaccination compulsory. The regulations appear to have been designed with a view to the quarantining of vessels and passengers arriving therein. The only paragraphs that I can find applicable to passengers arriving at inland places are pars 47 ~~to~~ 51 inclusive, and these clauses only deal with cases where the disease is suspected to be or is actually present in the car or carriage which I do not understand was the case in the present instance. I presume there must be some further regulations applicable to the case under consideration, and I would be obliged if you would let me see them before I attempt to answer the questions submitted by Mr Buckworth. In the meantime I return all the papers.

After a further examination of the Act and the regulations which you submit, I do not find that there is anything authorizing the compulsory vaccination of persons coming into Canada, nor can I find anything to warrant the quarantine officers in preventing any person who refuses to be vaccinated from coming into Canada.
