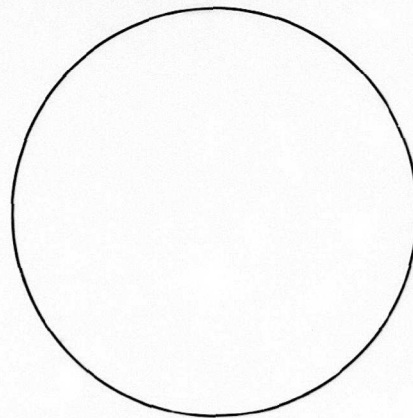

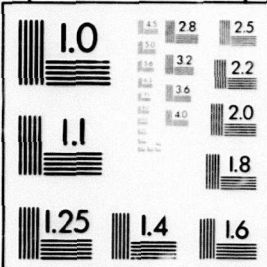

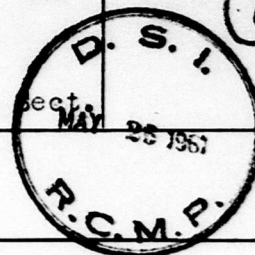

**Workers Attend Rally****Ban on Nuclear Tests  
May Day Appeal**

NATAL, B.C. (HNS) — Sponsored by the Michael Local Union District 18, UMWA, a largely attended May Day rally was held Monday in the Union Hall at Natal. With fine weather prevailing the Natal-Michel Band enlivened the proceedings.

Attending the rally were workers from throughout the Crow's Nest Pass. Invited speakers present included Tom Uphill of Fernie, Harry McKay, MLA of Fernie, Lloyd Phillips of Fernie, Jerry Flanagan of Trail, Jim Patterson of Kimberley, Donald MacDonald of Calgary and Harvey Murphy of Vancouver, the latter as President District 1, International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers.

Samuel English, secretary of Michel Local Union, acted as chairman. Invited speakers who were unable to attend included Edward Boyd, president District 18, United Mine Workers of America, Clem Thompson, mayor of Kimberley, Murray L. McFarlane, MP Kootenay East of Cranbrook and Lee Nimsick, MLA of Cranbrook. Speakers present from Trail and Kimberley represented the International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers.

The May Day manifesto was for peace, jobs and Canadian independence, it was said.

**ADOPT RESOLUTIONS**

Several resolutions were adopted at the rally, to be forwarded to the Federal Government in Ottawa. A complete ban on all nuclear tests and 50 per cent cut in arms expenditures was called for; also that the Canadian Government protest to the U.S. Government its interference in the affairs of Cuba. Resolutions on unemployment asked: 1. Jobs: through Public works and secondary industry, world wide trade and processing natural resources. 2. Until jobs provided: Raise unemployment insurance benefits. Increase benefits to 75 per cent of current earnings; benefits in effect for full period of unemployment; extend coverage to all workers, extend seasonal benefits until enactment of above.

3. Welfare: Increase federal portion to provide for 50 per cent increase overall. 4. Maximum hours of work: legislate a national 40 hour week law with strong provisions to discourage overtime.

5. Minimum Wage Act: National legislation for minimum hourly straight time rate of \$1.25.

Step up program and

as DVA institute a retraining program in industrial plants.

**SURPLUS FOOD**

7. Distribute surplus food: Introduce a supplementary food distribution system to give Canada's surplus food to the unemployed. 8. Social Legislation: Increase old age pension to \$75 at 65 years of age. Introduce a National Health Plan: increase family allowances by 50 per cent.

9. Enact the "Full Employment Act" requested by the Canadian Labor Congress.

This year's May Day rally slogan was "United in the Fight Against War and Reaction".

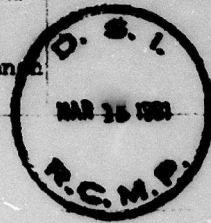

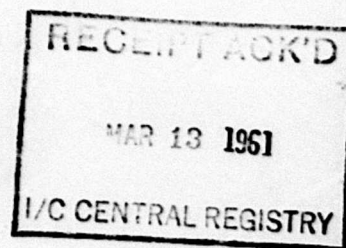

1. [redacted] William TUOMI arrived in Coleman, Alberta, via Greyhound Bus at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, 11-2-61, and was met by Eustace MALANCHUK. Both of the aforementioned then proceeded to the MALANCHUK residence where TUOMI remained for the night.

2. [redacted] a dinner at the MALANCHUK residence at Noon on Sunday, 12-2-61.

3. [redacted] approx. 25 persons attended the affair on 12-2-61 and an outline of the program was as follows:

- (a) Dinner: 12:00 noon to 2:00 p.m.
- (b) Address by TUOMI at 2:00 p.m., introduction by MALANCHUK.
- (c) Presentation of shirt and tie as a birthday gift to SHAW by MALANCHUK, followed by a few brief remarks by TUOMI.
- (d) Collection - (\$58.00 collected)

4. [redacted] MALANCHUK introduced TUOMI as the Provincial Leader of the C.P. of C. in Alberta, stating it was an honour to have him attend a meeting in Coleman.

5. [redacted] TUOMI began his speech by stating that Russia at one time had contemplated launching a tremendous attack on the U.S.A. by a concentrated effort of all her military capabilities. However, her spy network revealed that the U.S.A. was militarily capable by its large stock of H-Bombs to retaliate and in return deliver a devastating blow to Russia. In view of the fact that Russia too would be destroyed in a war against the U.S.A., Khrushchev has become convinced that the only way that Communism will win out over Capitalism is by peaceful co-existence. Tuomi further stated it is the belief of Khrushchev that Capitalism will crumble from within and it is only a matter of time until Communism will triumph and, therefore the Peace movement is to the advantage of the Communists.

6. Tuomi stated that Russia and China had not been in agreement on the policy of peaceful co-existence as China believed that the only way to destroy

... Capitalism was by war. Therefore, Khrushchev called a Conference of Communist Parties in Moscow in November 1960 which was attended by a high ranking Chinese Communist Executive Member to settle the ideological differences. At the conference China agreed to Khrushchev's views that the only safe policy for the advancement of communism was through peaceful co-existence. Tuomi stated that Tim BUCK also attended the conference as the representative of the C.P. of C.

7. [redacted] TUOMI stated that Capitalism will eventually deteriorate to the extent where it will afford an opportunity for the people to take over the Government, as in Cuba and nationalize all U.S.A. investments in Canada. [redacted] although TUOMI did not mention revolution as the means of taking over the Government of this country, he made it clear that he approved of the manner in which Cuba was taken over by Fidel CASTRO.

8. [redacted] when TUOMI spoke on Sunday, it had not as yet been reported that LUMUMBA had died and TUOMI stated that LUMUMBA would eventually transform the Congo into a Communist State on the side of Russia.

9. TUOMI stated that what is needed in Canada is a united front of the C.C.F., Labour, and the Communists, to throw off the Capitalist rulers. He stated, therefore, that the New Party should be supported and infiltrated whenever it was to the Communist advantage and was of the opinion that if the New Party is elected to power in the future it can in time be sufficiently infiltrated to give the Communists control.

10. [redacted] the conclusion of his speech, TUOMI stated that a membership drive will begin in earnest in the very near future to build up Party strength.

11. [redacted] later in the afternoon he overheard a conversation between TUOMI and Pauline (Mrs. Eustace) MALANCHUK about a Women's Peace Movement in which TUOMI stated even Mrs. PEARSON was member. [redacted] unable to learn more about the movement or further particulars on the identity of the aforementioned woman.

12. [redacted] SHAW was presented with a shirt and tie by MALANCHUK as a birthday gift on behalf of those present. TUOMI then stated that SHAW is one of the original members of Communist Party in the Pass and was a good friend of Tim BUCK. TUOMI stated that SHAW has given devoted support to the Party all these years and wished him many more years of health and service on behalf of the Provincial Executive.

13. [redacted] a collection was taken up by MALANCHUK and a total of \$58.00 collected which was given to TUOMI for the National Party Fund. [redacted] everyone present donated.
