Your above referenced letter gave the names of the 3 heirs to the above Estate, namely Francis, George and Nelda Finlayson of the Long Lake-58 Band of this Agency. Frank's portion of the Estate, amounting to \$166.06, (Ck. 003855) was received here in December from you and was duly transmitted to him at White River, Ontario.

Mr. George Finlayson has called into this Office and requested that his portion of the Estate be rendered to him, as he is in need of funds, as he has only been working intermittently. George will be 23 years old in six week's time, and is still single. Since his return from Active Service Overseas a year ago, he has not succeeded in getting steady employment and thus has found the going tough financially, to use plain ordinary language.

Thus, it would appear advisable to pay to George Finlayson his share of the Estate, and I would recommend that a Cheque be made to his Order and sent here as soon as possible, where it will be registered and transmitted to him at Longlac, Ontario.


I have for acknowledgment your letter of November 16th advising that Frank Finlayson, one of the heirs of the estate of L.V.N. Finlayson is now twenty-two years of age and has requested that he be paid his share of the estate funds.

The funds to the credit of the estate at this time total \$498.18 and while a cheque is being requisitioned in favour of Frank Finlayson for his one-third share - \$166.06, nevertheless we are not at all certain that the money should be paid to him in view of your statement that he is employed and your failure to state why he wishes the money.

We have for sometime now been reluctant to pay out savings to an Indian merely because he is now legally of age, and require in all cases where the payment is substantial that the agent indicate for what use the money is required and definitely state whether in his opinion the Indian is capable of using it to good advantage.

If there is any question in the agent's mind that the Indian intends to squander it on luxuries, the practice is not to allow the full amount to be drawn but to pay it out in smaller sums over a period of some time.

In the present instance therefore, while a cheque for Frank's full share is going forward to you, we wonder whether he should be paid in view of the fact that he is presently employed and if you have any suspicion as to his lack of need for the money, it is suggested that the cheque be returned together with your comments on the case.

I wish to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of September 14th and note your comments regarding the circumstances of the family of the above noted deceased.

A further investigation into the estate has revealed that the parties mentioned in your letter have no interest in the funds on hand at the Department, the said funds - \$451.88 - representing the interest of the three children of the late John Finlayson in the estate of their grandfather, L.V.N. Finlayson. According to our records their names are George, Frank and Josephine Nelda Finlayson.

I would accordingly request that you investigate the circumstances of the said children and let us have a recommendation as to the use that should be made of monies to their credit and at the same time definitely ascertain their ages.

EXTRACT from letter written by J. G. Burk, Indian Agent, Port Arthur, Ont., dated September 14 1943, addressed to Mr. L. W. McCutcheon, Chief Treasury Officer, Indian Affairs Branch, Dept. of Mines & Resources, Ottawa, Ont.

L.V.N. Finlayson's wife died in 1929 at Longlac, Ont. and he also died in 1931. Of his family there are living at the present time Duncan Finleyson, Mrs. E. Boissonneau and Mrs. J. Gagnon, residing at Longlac, Ont. and Mrs. Roht. Michano and Mrs. Eli Michano living at Coldwell and the Pic reserve, Heron Bay, respectively. Of this family, the only one who is really in need, at the present time, is Mrs. Eli Michano who is widowed and has a large family. I would suggest that for the present with the exception of Widow Michano's share, the money be left on deposit, but that her share be forwarded to the Agency trust account for her disposal.

Accordingly, in addition to the proofs of death of the assured we will require evidence of the death of the named beneficiary and a declaration setting out the number of times the assured was married and to whom, the names and ages of all his children, together with the names and ages of any children issue of a deceased child. 




