1. Further to my report of the 20-2-39, I wish to report that there was a branch of the WORKERS BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION OF CANADA formed at Dominion, N.S., some years ago, and a large number of Ukrainians in the Dominion and Glace Bay districts joined the organization. Subsequently, on learning that its aims were communistic, the great majority of the new members broke away, and formed a society of their own.

2. So far as can be learned, there are still five members of the original association in Dominion, and a few more in Glace Bay, and they hold weekly meetings at a hall in Dominion. It is possible that the name has been changed to the Independent Mutual Benefit Federation, but I have been unable to find anyone who is familiar with that name.

The Ukrainian Benevolent Society held a dance at their Hall at Dominion No. 1. on Saturday night. There was a big crowd but there were no speeches.

The meeting called for Glance Bay on Sunday morning, to pick delegates to go to Russia, did not materialize.

J.B. McLauchlan, John H. Ewasuk and Steve Krassa were the only ones to show up.

The meeting of the Ukrainian Society at Dominion in the afternoon was attended by over 300. J.B. McLauchlan, Mrs. Whitfield and Steve Felitia spoke. Steve said; - "The Red Flag will fly over Canada before the end of 1932". He explained that the Communist Party wanted two English speaking and one Ukrainian from every Province in Canada, to go to Russia for four months; and to be ready to start at once so that they would be in Russia for May first. The locals of the Province to pay for the delegates' transportation to ^{Russia} after that the International would pay all expenses.

The job was offered to three, all of whom refused. J.B. McLauchlan was nominated but Felitia refused to put forward his name. "He is our teacher and we can't afford to lose him for even a week" he said.

2

X Mrs. Whitfield brought the names of 200 new members. George Havuluck brought the names of 90 and Sam Kayluk the names of 80 new members. So nobody was appointed to go to Russia yet.

The mail to and from Toronto is handed in the Dominion No. 1. Post Office.

The literature is kept in a closet in the Ukrainian Hall at Dominion.

The "Young Worker" was sold at the meeting, also "Canadian Labor Defender" a mimeographed monthly review, Price ten cents.


The Ukrainian Benevolent Society are not all Red but they are being used by McLauchlan, Mrs. Whitfield and Felitia.

The Hall at Dominion (on the Gardiner Road just across the town line bridge) is about the only place they can get a big hearing of the foreigners. The audience is mostly Poles and Russians? No Italians.



This Foreign Labour organization is steadily progressing and has a present membership of about 200 men and women. A few radicals have joined this organization with the sole purpose of using it for their propaganda work. They now have a good chance to use this Hall and speak before an audience of foreign miners. I learned that Jim Parker, who is District organizer of the Communist Party of Canada for Nova Scotia, joined the Workers Benevolent Association in Dominion in order to carry on his agitation. He addressed one Sunday meeting before I came to Cape Breton on my present visit.

On Sunday, December, 15th., John Evasuk (Communist) and I went from Glace Bay to Dominion No 1., and we were present when the meeting was held by the Workers Benevolent Association. Evasuk asked permission from the Chairman to address the meeting and in his speech he explained that, from previous meetings and everyday conversations with the miners, he knows that there are many of our men (foreigners) who have a desire to go to Soviet Russia to live and work there, instead of working all their lives and making a profit for BESCO. He said that he had received information from Soviet Russia that all men who desire to go to Soviet Russia can organize the Miners Commune and they could settle as miners in the Don Basin, a mining district in Soviet Russia. Further Evasuk described how easily and happily the miners live and work in Soviet Russia under the Communist rule of that country. He said that there was a great change in Soviet Russia; factories which were previously run by the big capitalists are now run by the workers through their Workers Committees. In the great Don Basin all the mines were confiscated from the capitalists and are now run by the miners, and living conditions are many times better than they were fifteen years ago. The miners in Soviet Russia work only six hours per day and all miners have one month holiday each year on full pay. All miners, when sick, can go to rest homes for two or three months, all expenses being paid by the Soviet State. All miners are provided with free working clothes, free housing, light, heating and water. He said that the Soviet plan, which is compulsory to all workers, provides for full wages being paid when they are sick. There are schools at each mine which provide free good technical education for the miners and their families. There are also workers clubs, theatres, picture shows, movies, and concerts, all provided free. John Evasuk said "These are the conditions in the Don Basin, in Soviet

Russia and conditions are about the same throughout Soviet Russia: These conditions are far far better than those of the miners in Nova Scotia or the U.S.A."

After his speech there was a discussion about these affairs, and man after man expressed his opinion. I noticed that some foreign miners were willing to go to Soviet Russia, but some were against it, because they have their own houses, their children were born in Nova Scotia and some said that their wives were against a move to Soviet Russia and are satisfied to live in Canada, etc. etc.

After this discussion and questions John Evasuk again spoke and he suggested that this organization should send one miner as a delegate to Soviet Russia in order to study the working conditions there. He said, "If we send one trusty man from here to Soviet Russia next Spring, while he is in Soviet Russia he could make a better bargain and terms for Nova Scotia miners, if we are willing to go to Soviet Russia".

After these remarks John Evasuk's proposal was not accepted, because, although some of the miners agree with him, the majority are uncertain, so this question was not decided and the whole matter was postponed to future meetings.

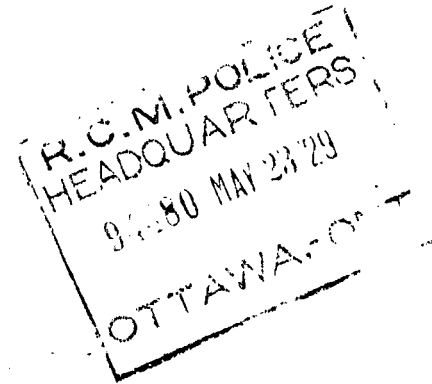

The above named Ukrainian organization at Dominion No. 1, Cape Breton, has a membership of 118 men and women, and owns its own hall.

The President and principal leader of this organization is one Harry SEGIDEN. This man is a miner and married, but they have no family.

The Secretary of this organization is Steve FILIPOWICH.

In the report of the Provincial Criminal Investigator, the names of the President and Secretary are given as, SYGIDYM, (President) and PHILIPS, (Secretary) which are not correct.

This organization continues to hold their business meetings on Sundays, and discuss ways and means of increasing the membership of their organization. It is a fact that every member was instructed to get more new members while he is working in the mine or at home. At these Sunday meetings, Harry Segiden reads and reports and articles from the Ukrainian Labor News, regarding the activity and progress of this organization in Winnipeg and other branches in different parts of Canada.

These Sunday meetings are very quiet and no Communist propaganda or revolutionary activity is carried on, and there is very little to report on; occasionally a communist speaker from Glace Bay or Sydney attends a meeting, and after the business is over, the visitors are given a chance to speak to the foreign crowd; even then the Communist speakers are very careful about what they say; usually they talk about the advantage of the workers being organized, and how profitable it is to subscribe to and read the labor papers, so they may learn the real facts and knowledge of the labor situation. Sometimes these Communist speakers make an appeal for donations to the Ukrainian Labor News, or The Worker, without mentioning that these papers are Communist organs; they make the impression upon the foreign miners that both these papers are just good labor papers, particularly in the case of the Ukrainian Labor News. It is a fact that the members of this organization, in most cases, can only read the Ukrainian language, and they are under the impression that the Ukrainian Labor News is the only Ukrainian paper in Canada, therefore it is quite natural that all these foreign miners should read and in many cases subscribe to this paper.

MAY 23 1929

On Sunday Mat 5th, I attended the meeting of this organization; only 34 men and women were present. After the business was over, a local Communist, John EVASUCK from Glace Bay, addressed the foreign audience. In his speech he mostly dealt with the conditions of the miners in Cape Breton; the discrimination of some miners by the Coal Company; he also criticized the miners Union and the present Executive of the U.M.W. for lack of activity. At the end of his speech he made an appeal for donations to the Worker.

I attended a similar meeting on Sunday May 12th, when this meeting ended with a speech by Steve Furlet, well known Communist leader from Sydney.

Steve Furlet in his speech described the present time as the period of prosecution of the foreign workers in Canada by the Authorities. He described the present situation in Toronto, where the foreign meetings were banned by the Police. He predicted that this prosecution and arrests of the workers will spread throughout Canada in a very short time. All these events, said Furlet, are pointing to the fact that Canada is preparing for war, and the Canadian Government want first to put completely out of existence all foreign labor organizations, because the foreign workers are the most advancing forces of the Canadian Labor class.

Steve Furlet asked the audience to support the Ukrainian Labor News, as the only fighting paper for the working class in the Ukrainian Language. During both these meetings the collection for the Communist papers did not take place, although Harry Segiden promised to donate some money for the press fund of both papers.

In conclusion, I wish to state that this organization is no further ahead now than it was ~~last~~ at this time last year, as far as the Communist movement is concerned. I already mentioned about this organization in my previous reports, and now I will only deal with some further facts.

There is no doubt that the radical Ukrainian section of the Communist Party of Canada, about five or six years ago, organised this "Workers Benevolent Association" first in Winnipeg and gradually through all the Provinces in Canada, for the purpose of getting the backward foreign labor element into some kind of an organized body under the benefit scheme. These foreign workers, in many instances, were afraid and not prepared to join the Communist Party of Canada, therefore this foreign association represents the raw material, or lower class organization, from which the Communists expect to get new recruits for their party. While this may be to some extent true that the Communists are utilizing this association for recruiting new members into their party in places like Winnipeg or Toronto, it is not so here in Dominion No. 1. To my knowledge, the local Communists failed to even get a single man from this association, that's why the foreign Communist branches in Sydney and Glace Bay have gone out of existence. There are only a few individuals (former leaders) left in both places, who represent only the nucleus; they are without a hall and have no regular meetings, although it is true that the local Communists would try to use this association in order to reorganise their own party. But up to the present time they have had no success, in spite of the fact that John Evasuck and Steve Furlet are both members of this association; their speeches have not aroused any enthusiasm or applause from the foreign crowd.

Owing to the fact that the settlement of Dominion consists mostly of Ukrainians, Poles and Austrians and

Italiansm it is not surprising that quite a number of these people joined this organization, under the cover of the benefit scheme, that \$10.60 per week will be paid to every member in case of sickness or accident. With this policy this association succeeded in getting 49 Italian members (Miners). Also the foreign miners are interested in this organization, because they have their own hall where they hold dances, and other forms of entertainment every saturday evening.

While in Dominion, I had an interview with Harry Segiden, President of this association, and I found that he is in sympathy more or less with the labor movement, but he is not a Communist. From the best of my observation I feel confident that the local Communist agitators have not succeeded in making any progress amongst the people of this association, and that as long as no influential Communist organizer comes among them, who could convince them to radical ideas, this association will not develop into a Communist organization.

I find that conditions in Dominion No 1 as reported by Mr.D.H. Nicholson, Provincial Criminal Investigator, are not exactly correct. His report overestimated the danger of this foreing organization. Being without the knowledge of the foreign languages, Ukrainian particularly, he was not in a position to get to the bottom of all things, nor mix or talk with the people confidentially, because the foreing miners knew him well as "Provincial detective"; therefore ~~xxxx~~ his opinion expressed about this association as "Communist Club" is not true, and further the list of foreign names, which he submitted and supposed to be communists, are not correct. I could not find among them any man who is a Communist. Perhaps one or two men from this list took part during the strike and riot, when the excitement enraged many miners, although they have never been members of the Communist Party. Also the poster in Ukrainian Languagem, which was tkane off the telephone post is absolutely harmless; it only contains the announcement of a big drive for new 7000 members throughout Canada, also it shown the total amount of money being paid as benefit for sickness and acci dents etc. etc., and on the bottom was written the date of the local meeting at Dominion.

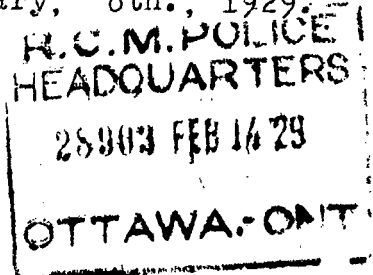

This Ukrainian organization, which established its branch in Dominion No. 1 about two months ago, has already about 120 members, who are mostly Ukrainian Poles and Russians. The organization has its own hall, though the building is not quite finished. I was informed that this organization had already held several meetings before I came to Cape Breton, and that some of these were addressed by Foreign Communists; John Evasuk and Sam Kavlu. The aims of this Ukrainian Benevolent Association are supposed to be the Insurance of the Foreign Workers in case of Accident or Sickness, and every member has to pay one dollar per month. I heard that there were cases of sickness amongst the members but they had not yet received any benefit, as had been promised to them.

The local Foreign Communists, after the failure of their own organization (Communist Party) are now more optimistic, and they hope to use this benevolent association as a bridge for carrying their propaganda and increasing the membership of the Communist Party. The fact is that the Communists were unable to carry out their work openly amongst the foreign miners, as they had found from previous experience that many of the foreign miners were against joining the Communist Party and were unprepared for Communism, as they feared oppression by the Coal Company. This is the reason that after the failure of the miner's strikes the Communist movement amongst the miners has never been developed to any extent. Now, under cover of the Benevolent Association, the foreign Radicals have a good chance to address the foreign miners during the meetings of the Association, and I learned that they even collected money for the Press Fund of the Communist paper "The Ukrainian Labor News". No doubt if this scheme is tried out in future the Communists may be successful in diverting part of the subscriptions and collections to the funds of the Communist party and its propaganda movement.


