Dear Comrades,

Our October Provincial Convention of the Party instructed the incoming Provincial Committee to establish a finance committee of the Provincial Executive to begin a systematic check on the financial standing of the Party.

The Executive has established such a committee and it is now working.

The Committee in its study of finances views with some concern the condition of the 1958 National Party Fund. To carry through its work it will have to depend on the co-operation of the whole party to fight for finances for Party work. NPF is the pivot of this relationship.

Enclosed is an up-to-date statement of funds received for NPF from all clubs and members at large in 1958.

You should study your own monthly report also. It makes the problem of funds more concrete for your area, because it shows how much and how often the Party receives help from the membership.

Note in this that there are several areas that have assumed the responsibility and asked on it.

The Committee urges all areas that are in arrears to take emergency action to clean up the outstanding balances of NPF for this year. This is the first step toward reorganizing finances.

The Committee, under direct supervision of the Provincial Executive, is drafting a budget for 1959; preparing some measures to re-organize finances; preparing suggestions for the 1959 NPF etc.. This information will be sent out well in advance for January meetings.

At this time, the Committee again urges you to take speedy action on your 1958 National Party Fund balances.

Dear Comrades,

Our October Provincial Convention of the Party instructed the incoming Provincial Committee to establish a finance committee of the Provincial Executive to begin a systematic check on the financial standing of the Party.

The Executive has established such a committee and it is now working.

The Committee in its study of finances views with some concern the condition of the 1958 National Party Fund. To carry through its work it will have to depend on the co-operation of the whole party to fight for finances for Party work. NPF is the pivot of this relationship.

Enclosed is an up-to-date statement of funds received for NPF from all clubs and members at large in 1958.

You should study your own monthly report also. It makes the problem of funds more concrete for your area, because it does show how much and how often the Party receives help from its membership.

Note in this that there are several areas that have assumed the responsibility and acted on it.

The Committee urges all areas that are in arrears to take emergency action to clean up the outstanding balances of NPF for this year. This is the first step toward reorganizing finances.

The Committee, under direct supervision of the Provincial Executive, is drafting a budget for 1959; preparing some measures to re-organize finances; preparing suggestions for the 1959 NPF, etc.. This information will be sent out well in advance for January meetings.

At this time, the Committee again urges you to take speedy action on your 1958 National Party Fund balances.

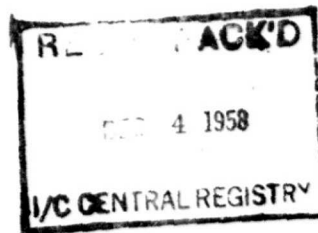

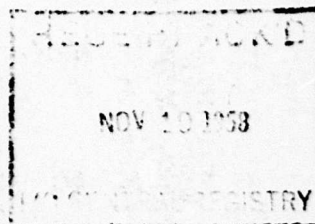

Dear Bill:

On first place, I have to apologize for not
replying to your correspondence. During the summer it was
very hard to get to-gether - number of them have been
out searching for jobs the others have been holidaying,
but since the holidays are over, there is a prospect
to orginize a meeting. If you are planning to make a
tour towards the end of Sept. or begining of Oct. then
stipulate to be in Coleman on Sat. so we will try to
orginize a social, but please, let us know a few weeks
in advance.

Next week I may go to Radium Hot Springs, B.C.
to enjoy holidays in conjuction with work, I will be
staying there about ten days and after my return, I will
be devoting all my spare time for organization work.

The situation in the Pass is very grim - the
employed miners working one or two days a week, the
unemployed are drawing their meagre insurance, and even
that for some miners will expire within next few weeks.
Miners with families have been fortunate to get job
in forestry or on highway, but this will last few weeks
more and then we could expect serious economical
situation.

The struggle of unemployed workers for their
existence is a serious prospective at forth coming
winter

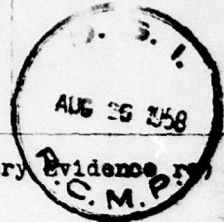

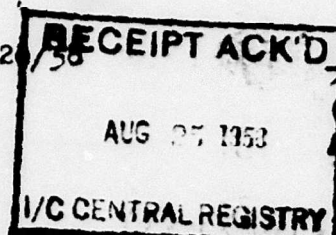
