INFORMATION:

1. [redacted] the following information concerning subject and her husband Alexa HOLYK. Subject was born 10-10-96 in the Ukraine. She arrived in Canada in 1913 and married Mike DANYLUK (phonetic) who was killed in a mine explosion at Michel, B.C. in 1917. As a result, she and her one son John HOLYK (phonetic), who has officially changed his name, moved from Michel to Coleman, Alberta. In 1920, subject married Alexa HOLYK (in Manitoba) and has lived with him since. The marriage has resulted in one son being born who is now resident of California who is known as William HOLYK. (Alexa HOLYK was born 2-10-93 at Slob Hanilla, Bukovina, Roumania and was issued Canadian Naturalization Certificate number 17553-62 on 13-3-63 at Calgary, Alberta. During 1966 he visited the U.S.S.R. for the first time since he immigrated to Canada. He was away from May to early July and he travelled alone. As far as his visit to the U.S.S.R. is concerned he spent 20 days in the village of his birth and the remainder of his time was divided approximately as follows: two days in Leningrad, five days in Moscow, five days in Kiev, three days in Lvov and three days in Chernikovsk. His travel to and from the U.S.S.R. was by air. Approximately six years ago subject visited the U.S.S.R. with a group of Ukrainian Canadians. Members of the tour gathered in Toronto and were under the leadership of William HROHONIUK (phonetic). The only other Albertan on the tour was Mrs. DANYLUK (phonetic) of Edmonton, Alberta who is not related to her former husband Mike DANYLUK (phonetic).

2. Neither subject nor Alexa HOLYK are committed to any particular political doctrine and are not now even to be considered as "pink". Both have strong ethnic interests and both profess that their allegiance is Canadian first and ethnic second. Organized Communism in Coleman is all but defunct. The Association of United Ukrainian Canadians (A.U.U.C.) ceased to exist two or three years ago. This has resulted from two reasons: The Communist element has become weak and several members who carried the organization died. The organization became defunct after the death of Andrew HALLUK (deceased). The Communist Party of Canada has been non-existent in the Coleman for years. As a result of the A.U.U.C. becoming defunct the Workers Benevolent Association took over the A.U.U.C. hall. The W.B.A. holds meetings quarterly and although there are Communist sympathizers within the organization there is no political content in the meetings. The Coleman Branch of the W.B.A. operates without outside interference and the point was

illustrated as follows: A year or two ago when Nick NAHOYILAK visited Coleman in his capacity of W.B.A. organizer he attempted to have the branch transfer their bank balance of two hundred dollars to the National office and this the Branch membership refused to do. Both subject and her husband hold office in the local branch of the W.B.A., the former being a member of the sick committee and the latter is an auditor. They subscribe to the Communist publication "Life and Word".

5. The biographical data supplied in paragraph (1) of this report is certainly in conflict with that which is on file. Memorandum dated 29-9-65 from the D.S.I. on subject's file records her date of birth as being 18-9-97.

The attachment from the D.S.I. accompanying his memorandum dated 28-2-67 records her birth date as being 10-10-96 which is consistent with that which is recorded in paragraph (1). In so far as paragraph (2) of this report is concerned, the information recorded is consistent with that appearing in subject's file. Her only recorded involvement with the Communist movement is membership in the W.B.A. In report dated 23-9-65 on subject's file, could not assess her "true political sympathies"

that there was not any political content at Branch meetings. subject as being a sympathizer of the A.U.U.C. or Federation of Russian Canadians (Reference report dated 26-10-61, A.U.U.C., Coleman, Alberta)

6. The biographical data supplied in paragraph (1) of this report is also in conflict with that which is recorded on Alexa HOLYK's file. Memorandum dated 26-7-65 from the D.S.I. indicates that he was born on 24-2-94 which is inconsistent with that which is

recorded in paragraph (1) of this report. There is also a conflict in the matter of his citizenship. May citizenship records please be checked to ascertain the circumstances that Certificate 37553-62 was issued as memorandum dated 26-7-65 from the D.S.I. indicates that he obtained his citizenship on 11-7-28 and that he received Certificate number 56151-A. A review of Alexa HOLYK's file indicates that he has been associated with the Communist movement for many years. At one time he held an executive position in the A.U.U.C. He is still a member of the W.B.A.

7. In the writers opinion subject and her husband are at the very most mildly sympathetic towards Communism.

if the HOLYK's were strong advocates of the Communist would have reported them as same. There is no evidence available to dispute the HOLYK's claim that there is no political content in W.B.A. Branch meetings: substantiated their claim. The fact that they read the Communist press publication, Life and Word, can not in this case be considered as suspected A.U.U.C. membership, as it has been reliably reported on several occasions that the A.U.U.C. in Coleman is defunct. The HOLYK's have strong ethnic ties and it is difficult to access where their Nationalistic sympathies lie. There is no evidence on file to suggest that they are Marxists.

This is in conflict with the information in the memorandum of the D.S.I. dated 26-7-65, which records his Certificate of Naturalization #56151-A, 11-7-28. Could the appropriate records be checked again to clarify this discrepancy, please.



1. [redacted] on the 4-9-63, a meeting of the Communist Party of Canada (C.P. of C.) Provincial Secretariat was held and the following members and guests attended same:

William TUOMI
George SOLOMON
Walter MAKOWECKI
Lucy KOWALIUK

2. [redacted] there was no agenda for this meeting, but TUOMI had stated that a list of work to be done by the C.P. of C. during September included the following:

- Discussions concerning the Canadian Tribune drive and Tribune circulation.
- The necessity to work out financial accounts up to the end of September, 1963.
- The working out of a budget.
- The preparation for a C.P. of C. Provincial Committee meeting and the setting of a date for same.
- The necessity to plan for the tour of William KASHTAN to Alberta during October, 1963.
- The Secretariat should have a Young Communist League (Y.C.L.) discussion sometime during September, 1963.

3. TUOMI advised that the C.P. of C. City Committee in Calgary would be holding a meeting on the 8-9-63, which he should attend. TUOMI would also remain in Calgary to attend a meeting of the C.P. of C. general membership on the 11-9-63. TUOMI proposed that he should also visit Drumheller on the weekend of 13-9-63 and return to Edmonton on or about the 16-9-63.

4. TUOMI stated that it was necessary to plan for a trip to Lethbridge, Alberta and the tour should be planned in conjunction with the Workers' Benevolent Association (W.B.A.) conference which will be held in Lethbridge on the 21-9-63. It was, therefore, proposed that William TUOMI should go to Lethbridge on the 28th and 29th September. TUOMI continued that there will be an Association of United Ukrainian Canadians (A.U.U.C.) seminar held in Lethbridge from 13th to 16th October, 1963. It would be the intention of TUOMI to help the C.P. of C.

members in Lethbridge with the organization of the farm union or at least check up on their preparation for same. It was further suggested that in regards to his trips to Lethbridge, M. LOWICKI should accompany TUOMI. TUOMI also stated that he will cover Calgary, Alberta while going to and returning from Lethbridge. It was further suggested that while in the south country, a visit should be made to the Crowsnest Pass even though the Party does not have much activity there at the moment.

5. TUOMI suggested that these trips should be made specifically for the purpose of discussing the ideological question with C.P. of C. club members at club meetings. TUOMI would also discuss the question of Party building, the Canadian Tribune drive, the selling of literature and public work of the Party. TUOMI will make every effort to have the members hold public meetings in their areas.

6. SOLOMON advised that there would be a W.B.A. conference in Calgary on the 22-9-63. Further, there will also be an A.U.U.C. conference in Calgary held on the 10th and 11th October, 1963. SOLOMON advised that he would be in Lethbridge during the week of September 9th, 1963 and would be meeting with the executives of the A.U.U.C. in order to prepare for the A.U.U.C. seminar in Lethbridge. SOLOMON advised that William HARASYM [REDACTED] would be in Alberta during October, 1963, and during his visit to Alberta, there will be several A.U.U.C. pre-convention discussions in Calgary. SOLOMON concluded that Nick ALEXIEWICH [REDACTED] would not be making any trips to the south country.

7. A general discussion then ensued as to the possibility of holding a Party conference in Edmonton, Alberta and it was decided that perhaps same should be held on 18th and 19th September, 1963. SOLOMON believed however, that there would be no need for such a conference unless it would be possible to have all of the young comrades attend same. SOLOMON advised that he had a meeting recently with William CHOMYN [REDACTED] and ALEXIEWICH, and ALEXIEWICH believed that the A.U.U.C. membership should have a discussion concerning the Canadian Council of National Groups (C.C.N.G.) even though the membership is unaware of what is happening in C.C.N.G. The A.U.U.C. has had no information from C.C.N.G. since the last federal election except for a weak call for "Canada Day". SOLOMON complained that several of the young members of the A.U.U.C. were willing to allow the older members to do most of the work. Therefore, there was the question of having the younger members of the A.U.U.C. realize their responsibilities as members of the C.P. of C. SOLOMON continued that if the young members were active in a series of other organizations, more responsibility from them would not be expected, but unfortunately they are not active in such organizations as community leagues and nuclear disarmament committees. TUOMI suggested that the tentative dates of 18th and 19th September would be best in order that CHOMYN could determine the weak points of the A.U.U.C. by then and could raise concrete questions to the younger members. SOLOMON believed that it was basically a question of understanding that is, the under-

Nick ALEXIEWICH should give a talk concerning the A.U.U.C. TUOMI and ALEXIEWICH could get together and decide what they should talk about at the conference. SOLOMON further advised that he was becoming very tired of this meeting and wished to leave.

SECRET

20. MAKOWICKI then became quite angry and advised that he had made proposals concerning what should be discussed at the conference and that this meeting appeared to be only "beating about the bush". MAKOWICKI also disagreed very strongly with the attitude of ALEXIEWICH giving a talk concerning the A.U.U.C. when SOLOMON was more suitable to do so. TUOMI suggested that the first night of the conference should be a general talk and on the second night, the meeting should deal with specifics. It was suggested by MAKOWICKI that the Secretariat should meet during the afternoon of 17th September, 1963 to decide finally what should be discussed at the conference. All agreed with this suggestion and it was further agreed that a meeting of the C.P. of C. Provincial Executive Committee should be held on the night of 20th September, 1963.

21. During the general discussion concerning the Communist Chinese and Russian dispute, SOLOMON believed that much time was being wasted by members of the Party concerning discussions on same because basically the C.P. of C. is a Russian party and, therefore, it is an agent of Russia. SOLOMON concluded the meeting by advising the members that at future meetings, they either come better prepared, speak openly or do not bother calling another meeting.

23. The ideological struggle referred to in paragraph 5 no doubt refers to the Communist Chinese/Russian dispute. Efforts are being made to establish what SOLOMON meant when he referred to the Ukrainian Party Committee in paragraph 11 and the Organization Committee as mentioned in paragraph 19. KISILEWICH is active in the New Democratic Party and the Canadian Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament in Edmonton, Alta.

24. It is apparent from the above Secretariat that the local Party faces a real problem in influencing the efforts of the A.U.U.C., C.C.N.C. and other national groups in terms of Party requirements. This is not a recent development, particularly in so far as the local A.U.U.C. is concerned.





2. During a general discussion regarding the Communist Party of Canada clubs and their members, it was agreed that the Party clubs at Coleman, Lethbridge and Calgary needed to be reorganized. According to TUOMI, whilst attending a City Committee meeting in Calgary on the 10-12-61, he observed that the meeting was being run very poorly. As a result, the Committee had the meeting adjourned until the 17-12-61. TUOMI stated that he would be attending the City Committee meeting in Calgary on the 17-12-61, and that he would try and straighten out the various difficulties within the City Committee and its members.

3. In conjunction with TUOMI's trip to Calgary, it was decided that two members of the Provincial Executive visit Coleman and Lethbridge so that they could try reorganizing Party clubs in the above mentioned areas. It was agreed that TUOMI visit Coleman on the 18th and 19th December, 1961, then be in Lethbridge on the 20th, 21st and 22nd December. SOLOMON stated that he would be in Lethbridge on the evening of the 19th December, 1961 and that he would contact the various members concerned in preparation for the meetings on the 20th, 21st and 22nd. SOLOMON could then meet with TUOMI when TUOMI arrived in Lethbridge, whereby the two could plan what strategy they would use at these meetings. SOLOMON further stated that if it was evident that a change of executives within the clubs would solve the different problems, they would get a new executive. TUOMI agreed with SOLOMON and stated that "new blood" would be the answer to the whole affair.

TUOMI, who was introduced by SOLOMON, gave the keynote address with the following highlights:

- (a) In listing the Party's accomplishments in Alberta, TUOMI stated that the Party now had a membership of 375, of which 72 had been recruited since Tim BUCK's birthday party last year. Alberta continues to maintain the Tribune leadership and, with an addition of 88 being obtained until the National Convention next January, the Tribune circulation will have increased 100%. Much has been done in the way of public meetings. The meetings have been held where they have never been held before with large attendances.
- (b) In the light of changing times, according to TUOMI, it would be necessary to reorganize the Party organization and its functions to meet the demands being made of its leadership.
- (c) Mass organizations are used primarily to further the peace movement and TUOMI urged all members to actively engage in the peace movement.

- (d) TUOMI advised that a resolution on unemployment had been sent to the investigating committee. It was necessary to have a strong farm movement, but little has been done for the farm issue program because of lack of resources such as knowledge.
- (e) In speaking on the New Democratic Party, TUOMI felt that it is not a substitute for the C.P. of C., but it also cannot be ignored since it is a step in the right direction. The new N.D.P. was not the end in itself because it is a party of reform and not a true socialist party, but because there is such a party and the working people are realizing its political obligations, the C.P. of C. should provide it with leadership. He urged that there be no sectarianism and the C.P. of C. members work with the N.D.P. members and create unity among the working class.
- (f) The tactics of the Party should be to promote the ultimate end by taking an active part in the municipal field, the Alberta Teachers Association, the home and school association and various other community organizations. In that way, the Party would have an ear to the masses and note what the issues are and see in what manner they could provide them with guidance, etc. An example of this was Comrade Tony JACOBSON's position as a councillor, who was not supported as a Communist, but rather his leadership-abilities were sought. The Party membership should be increased through the public work being done and in this way, the press will be built up as well. Additionally, the Young Communist League and their press will benefit.
- (g) In dwelling on the necessary reorganization of Party thought and work, TUOMI stressed the closer relationship between leadership and membership as being necessary to create a situation where each member will contribute the utmost and thereby form a Party where the leadership stems from the membership. The 81st Party statement and the 22nd congress show the Party members that they are living in a changing world. It was necessary, therefore, to provide leadership to lead the world away from war and extinction into a greater, fuller life in a socialist society in transit to communism.

Organizational report by Walter MAKOWECKI with the following highlights:

- (a) MAKOWECKI announced that there had been a 27% increase in Party membership in the last year and 69% increase in Tribune circulation.
- (b) Defined our present main enemy as being the United States monopoly. In the world situation, the U.S. oligarchy is the main enemy. The proof that MAKOWECKI produced that capitalism is doomed is the U.S.S.R., which is in a state of transition to communism.
- (c) Listed the following accomplishments in the past year:
 - (1) Sylvan Lake camp was built.
 - (2) Schools were held there.
 - (3) The change in the World Books store whereby the Party obtained a separate office, resulted in more time for himself and TUOMI to visit clubs - all the Party clubs in Alberta had been visited recently, with the exception of Rycroft and Innisfree. This organizational change also gives the Party leadership the opportunity to cope with various developments, e.g., distributing leaflets on the resumption of nuclear tests by the U.S.S.R.
- (d) He stressed the need for more membership initiative and membership leadership. He urged that they not wait for the Provincial executive before they act.
- (e) He pointed out that the Provincial Committee structure was not geared to changing times. He urged that the Provincial Committee be reorganized to provide more leadership to interpret rising issues and to develop tactics.
- (f) In the light of the changes required, the Y.C.L. would play a vital important part. It was the responsibility of Party members to support the Y.C.L. as much as to support the mass organizations, etc.
- (g) A Party leadership school was being planned for June at Sylvan Lake for Party directors, Club secretaries and Club Chairmen, etc.

that younger leadership be accepted since they must not be a drag on the younger membership.

George SOLOMON

Spoke on mass work. Because of changing times and present situations, they can get more action from various groups. He urged that more mass action be taken on certain issues, such as peace. He used as an example house meetings which evolve into public meetings.

Alfred STENBERG

Spoke on the role of the Party and its position in the community. Stressed the need for action in municipal issues on basic matters within the home and school association, the Alberta Teachers Association, etc., touched lightly on the Y.C.L. in relation to changing times.

Tony JACOBSON

Spoke on municipal work explaining that the leadership given by the Party is appreciated and that it is possible to get a following from good leadership. It was the duty of the Party members, whether they liked public life or not, to get out and plug. An example of the gain to be had was the defeat of the MANNING effort to get sales tax through on a resolution from Minnburn, Alberta through the efforts of himself and John HARRY.

Mike UHRYN

The theme of his talk was Party education. It was not good enough to be a Communist in name only and a thorough study of the Party to understand changes was very necessary.

Jean (Mrs. Frank) MARICLE

Stressed the need for more schools, particularly necessary for the education of youth. According to her, this generation is faced with what the youth were faced with in the thirties and they must be prepared to meet it.



2. [redacted] George SOLOMON acted as chairman for the first session, which got under way at 2.30 P.M. on September 30th. William TUOMI was elected as recording secretary for the entire meeting. TUOMI opened the meeting with a report from the last National Executive meeting, his speech lasting an hour. Source has supplied the following, which is a brief summary of TUOMI's talk.

3. TUOMI said that the most burning question today is the present Berlin crisis. He said that the C.P. of C. clubs should conduct as many meetings as possible to arouse public opinion against rearming Germany, and also the point of no nuclear arms for Canada. He said that if the Americans can be made to back down on the German question, it may well be the final crisis of Capitalism. With respect to the Canadian scene at present, the speaker said that the main enemy in the fight for socialism, is the oligarchy composed of Canadian and American big business. In the fight against big business, he said the brightest light in many years, RS.

(paragraph 16 cont'd... SYLVAN LAKE district for banquets, weddings, etc. The last item concerning the Sylvan Lake School was an announcement by TUOMI that the 110 volt Delco plant used at the school was also donated by an anonymous person.

17. TUOMI presented the financial report, covering the Provincial finances from October 1st, 1960 to September 30th, 1961, and also a separate report covering the Sylvan Lake School. TUOMI revealed that comrade KISLEVICH (phonetic), who just finished his Commerce degree at the University of Alberta, is now auditing the C.P. of C. books. TUOMI also explained the use of yellow paper by the Party office, saying it costs much less than the better grade of white paper. TUOMI concluded his report by saying that the C.P. of C. in Alberta subsidize the Y.C.L. by \$60.00 per year, but during the past year they used only \$20.00 of their subsidy.
