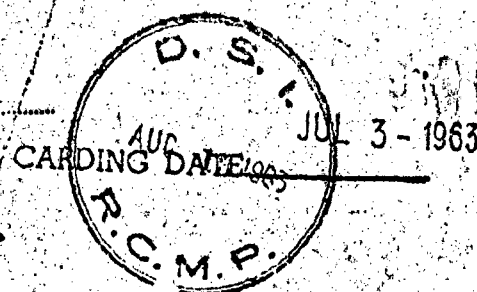

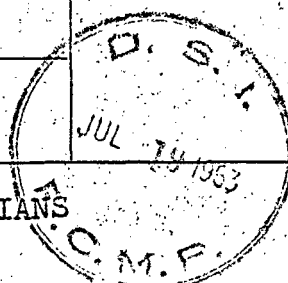

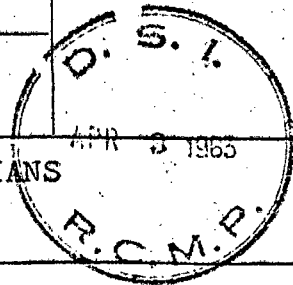

5. Max ROSHKO, the Provincial Secretary, stated that in general the A.U.U.C. is a cultural educational organization and among its purposes is to fight for better conditions for the Canadian people, to fight for peace and against nuclear arms.

6. ROSHKO announced the following plans and resolutions and asked the Convention to adopt them.

a) The organization and membership drive quotas have been tentatively set as follows:

IV) organize more English Speaking Branches in the district.

V) celebrate the 100th anniversary of Olga KOBELANSKA, a Ukrainian writer.

VI) to change the A.U.U.C. Quebec Provincial Committee to the A.U.U.C. Quebec District Committee. The A.U.U.C. Branches in Northern Quebec to come under the jurisdiction of the Timmins district ... "5"

...and that Nova Scotia A.U.U.C. Branches would be on their own. Only the Montreal and Ottawa Branches would come into the jurisdiction of the Quebec District Committee. This Committee should be composed of 11 members.

VII) The current total membership in the new district is 136

7. A number of persons took part in a general discussion based on the points raised. The first session adjourned for lunch.

8. The session began at 2 p.m. with a speech by William HARASYM. He discussed the Canadian Born problem. He wants to open English Speaking Branches in Lachine, Ville LaSalle and Pte. St. Charles. He said that the A.U.U. Montreal English Speaking Branch was doing very well with 11 members. Now that Zinowiy NYKOLYSHYN and his wife moved in Montreal from Winnipeg, Man., this membership will be 13. He urged all present to work hard to build up English Speaking Branches.

9. Anton KACHMAR, believed to have been the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, announced that the Committee had met and were in agreement to recommend the resolutions as outlined by ROSHKO. The resolutions were the adopted by the Convention.

10. Dmytro KOSTASZEC of the Credentials Committee reported that there were 34 Branch delegates and 12 official guests present at the Convention.

11. Peter PROKOP stated that the changes made in the District, i.e. reducing the territory and changing from a Provincial Committee to a District Committee should make it much easier to carry out organizational work, and make efforts in the cultural and educational fields more effective. He urged the new Quebec District Committee and the delegates present to carry out the resolutions of the Convention with increased efforts. He suggested they should go out and speak to people about the A.U.U.C. and to explain all the advantages of the organization. Efforts should be made to win members of the Twentieth Century Society back to the ranks of the A.U.U.C. Attempts should be made to increase the string orchestra, the choir and organize Pioneer groups. He suggested that the A.U.U.C. Lachine Women's Branch should be re-organized as soon as possible. Roy SEMAK is in Montreal for this, and everyone should co-operate to make his job easier. He stated that Zinowiy NYKOLYSHYN was a very good organizational worker and lecturer in Winnipeg, Man., before he came to Montreal, and no doubt would be of considerable assistance to the Quebec District Committee.

... The new District, including all Montreal Branches as well as Ottawa, Ontario, covers a territory similar to that of the W.B.A. District Committee. This change, undoubtedly, is designed to increase the efficiency of administration of A.U.U.C. policy in the districts concerned.

16. It will be noted that the Convention stressed the importance of work among Canadian Born Ukrainian with a rather ambitious plan to form a number of English Speaking Branches in the area. William HARASYM has offered to spend two weeks to assist in this project. The Convention also pointed out the need to organize Pioneer Groups as well. No doubt A.U.U.C. officials are well aware that the organization is lacking considerably in younger members of all ages. Their efforts toward their goal will be watched with interest.

17. Photographs were taken at this Convention and will be forwarded as soon as processing and identification has been completed. A report from another source, present at the Convention, will be forwarded shortly.

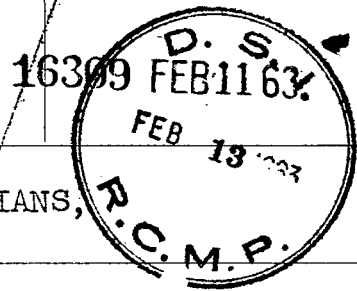

THE OPENING SESSION

The 10th National Convention of the AUUC was called to order in the ULT, Toronto, July 2, at 10 A.M.

Michael Korol, chairman of the NEC of AUUC, made the opening address. "CARRY OUT A SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN FOR THE ORGANIZATIONAL FUND OF THE AUUC". - The report is signed by M. Roshko, Montreal. According to his report, a total of \$6,242.50 was raised in the March-April campaign by members of the AUUC and the WBA branches in Montreal

district. The writer admits that the set quota of the Provcom has not been fulfilled, as not all of the branches fulfilled their own quotas.

The AUUC branch in Lachine achieved the best results in the campaign, having fulfilled its quota 200% and in addition to the prescribed sum, members of the branch collected \$1,500 for the repairs of their building (the ULT). E. N. Bernaky, candidate for "star" of the branch, was pronounced the winner of the popularity contest. He is lauded for his efforts in the campaign.

The branches of the two organization in Montreal proper collected \$1,200 for the organizational fund and in addition to this, "a considerable sum" for the erection of the local ULT.
