



On revision, it is thought that the pencil design would be more appropriate than the initials "G.M.P", which would not convey its full meaning and authority to anyone not acquainted with same.




I am opposed to the multiplication of badges.

Militia Council having recently decided that all Overseas Units shall wear one badge (the Maple Leaf), I think Military Police should be satisfied with the same; and when in Uniform the Regulation G.M.P. Armlet should be retained.

If the Armlet is of poor quality a sample should be returned to S.O.O. Montreal for exchange, and the sample should be passed to this office for action by Director of Contracts. This is the first complaint ever received against this Armlet.

As to a badge for plain clothes Police, that question is beyond me.



G.M.P. Armllets.

Sir:-

With reference to the armllets which were issued to me for use of the G.M.P. I would call your attention to the very poor quality of these articles and beg to inform you that I am now using them for the Military Police at Guy St. Barracks. I should be glad therefore, if I could be issued with 18 blue armllets Plain no lettering and 18 white metal shields to the enclosed design, which Messrs. Hemsley of Bleury St. Montreal, are willing to supply at the cost of \$1.00 each.

Some badge of this kind is necessary as I have a number of plain clothes men working in conjunction with the uniform G.M.P. arresting deserters and doing work of this nature and several cases have occurred, on which they have been interfered with in the execution of their duty owing to their having no recognized badge as showing their authority to arrest and deal with men.

If the issue of this badge of this description is authorized it can be worn by the plain clothes men inside their coats, as is the custom with civil police here, it can also be worn by the uniform Police on the blue armllet and thus there would be uniformity in the G.M.P.
