Information received through the Intelligence Advisory Committee of the federal government revealed COSMOS 954, a Soviet Radar Ocean Reconnaissance Satellite (RORSAT) with a small nuclear power source was out of ground control. On 1978/01/06, the satellite began tumbling towards earth. It was to re-enter the earth's atmosphere but at that time the location was unknown. On 1978/01/24, the satellite survived re-entry and crashed near Great Slave Lake, NWT. The RCMP's presence was requested for guarding some of the debris as well as performing any police duties which may have arisen. When the clean-up was completed, the Department of External Affairs requested the RCMP's input into the preparation of a claim against the USSR for compensation for damage incurred by Canada in the search and recovery of the radioactive parts of the satellite. The cost of the clean-up was over \$14,000,000.00 of which Canada requested just over \$6,000,000.00 compensation.

At 8:30 A.M. of 30 JAN 78, Cst. W.B. OTTMANN and myself were required to attend the Detachment office. This was with regards to maintaining security on a portion of the Russian Satellite which fell on Great Slave Lake approximately 20 miles northwest of Fort Reliance on 24/1/78. After a short briefing by the Officer Commanding Yellowknife Sub/Division on our responsibilities and requirements, we were to attend at the R.C.M.P./D.N.D. hangar in full Arctic Survival Gear. We were advised that D.N.D. would be providing full rations, tent, stoves, lanterns, fuel, and sleeping bags. Cst. OTTMANN and myself arrived at the hangar at 9:15 A.M. as we were due to be transported to the location of the debris at 9:30 A.M. We were also informed that we would be accompanied by two D.N.D. members, but were not aware of their names. No one at the hangar knew very much about who we should see or where we should go. By 9:45 A.M., we were becoming quite concerned, and after making some enquiries, we finally found out that we were to go to D.N.D. Supply for sleeping bags and various other equipment. There we met our D.N.D. counterparts, Warrant Officer MacEACHERN and Sgt. Jim GRADY. Finally, after receiving our equipment, all was loaded aboard the D.N.D. Chinook Helicopter for transport to Satellite #2 site. At 10:30 A.M., the engines were started and by 10:40 A.M. we were asked to disembark and wait in the Wardair lounge as there was engine trouble with the Chinook. We reboarded the helicopter at 11:15 A.M., took off and had a short flight over Yellowknife after which we returned to the Airport where the helicopter went unserviceable. The Chinook was unloaded in the Wardair hangar and all the equipment was transferred to the D.N.D. hangar. The new plan for transportation was to utilize one Twin Otter and two Hughes helicopters. In the confusion and indecision while everyone (i.e., security team, scientists) was awaiting transportation instructions, the Colonel in charge of the operation asked, "who wants to go in which aircraft?" After more confusion, we were finally loaded and in the air by 1:51 P.M.

2. We arrived at the first site of Satellite #2 at 3:30 P.M. We had to unload and make camp. The final portions of our camp raising were done in the darkness. Instantly we encountered trouble with one of the two CP-300 lanterns and both stove generators. That night we made radio contact with Yellowknife Detachment and requested that D.N.D. be contacted and advised that we required parts for our Coleman stoves, a CP-500 lantern, Yukon heater, batteries for our Single Side Band Radio, fuel and reading material.

3. At this time, we were approximately 20 miles northwest of Fort Reliance. The debris from the Satellite was located approximately 1000 yards directly south of our campsite in clear view.

4. On 31 JAN 78, no supplies were received from any of the several aircraft which arrived. At least three different persons were contacted and given the same message for supplies as had been relayed to Yellowknife Detachment. While flying over the area, D.N.D. located a second more severely radio active area approximately 5 miles to the south east of our present location.

5. On the 1 FEB 78, we were instructed by the Colonel to move our camp from our first location to an area closer to the more radio active site as the first site had already been cleaned up. On the morning of 1 FEB 78, we received extra Naptha and a 3000 BTU Catalytic Heater. The Colonel decided to also drop us a ski-doo and fuel to facilitate our move and to allow us to patrol closer to the site. As the ski-doo was not dropped until late in the evening of 1 FEB 78, the move was planned for the next day. By the evening of 1 FEB 78, we had still received no lantern, stove parts, batteries or reading material.

6. In the A.M. of 2 FEB 78, we moved our campsite approximately 3 miles southeast. Shortly after our move was completed, our ski-doo broke down and was unrepairable. Even at our new campsite, we were still some 3000 yards away from the second "hot spot", with no means of ready access to the area.

7. Although numerous aircraft were sighted in the area on this date, none stopped at our new campsite either to drop requested supplies or see if all was O.K. Finally, on the evening of 2 FEB 78, contact was made with S/Sgt. ARMSTRONG and the equipment was again requested.

8. In the A.M. of 3 FEB 78, it was learned that Police Aircraft CF-MPF was on its way from Yellowknife with supplies and replacements for us. CF-MPF landed at 12:15 P.M. dropping Csts. LUCHTMEIJER and WOODS and Warrant Officer STENHOUSE as relief. All the supplies we had ordered arrived with our replacements. We arrived back at Yellowknife at 2:30 P.M.

9. No persons other than military and scientists were encountered during our stay at Satellite #2. While on this patrol, the daylight hours were normally spent with work around the camp and general surveillance of the satellite debris and work going on in the area. Our nights were consumed with a continual fight against the cold.

10. In my opinion, this patrol was highly unnecessary as the areas of radiation were well marked, and the chance of anyone venturing out that way from Fort Reliance remote. The entire operation with respect to the security aspect was very poorly organized and during our stay outside Reliance, we were not very well looked after.

O.C. YELLOWKNIFE:

1. Reference the radio request made by our members on 30 JAN 78 for additional parts and supplies, it has now been learned that an immediate phone call was made to the D.N.D. by C/M K. GEIBELHAUS. A complete list of their requirements was given to a Sgt. SHARPE and he stated that he would get the supplies out to them the next day, 31 JAN 78.

2. I first learned of their requirements when I was contacted by telephone at my residence by Cst. R.W. HOBBS at approximately 8:30 p.m. on 1 FEB 78. As there was no way of getting the equipment together or to them that night, I advised Cst. HOBBS to inform them via radio that I would get this equipment to D.N.D. first thing in the morning.

3. At 8:30 a.m. on 2 FEB 78, I contacted Major BOB ELRICK at N.R.H.Q. and informed him of the requirements of the men in camp. He agreed to get the equipment while I got together the required supplies and stated that as long as I had them back to him by 10:00 a.m. that he would ensure that they were taken out on the next flight. I boxed up the supplies which I was required to get and delivered same personally to Major ELRICK at 9:45 a.m. on 2 FEB 78.

4. While attending a briefing session at 4:00 p.m. this same date, it was learned that those supplies and equipment had not been delivered by D.N.D. At the same time, Major ELRICK made the request that the Force utilize the Police aircraft to transport in this material as well as new personnel to guard the scene near Fort Reliance, N.W.T. This was done the following day, 3 FEB 78.

5. All the members involved in the guarding of the "hot spots" in the Fort Reliance area have confirmed that the whole area was well marked and that they did not encounter any persons, other than scientists and D.N.D. personnel. It is felt that the presence of the Force was not required at these locations but that D.N.D. have the men and equipment to adequately guard these areas. The sparse population in this particular area was well informed of the danger of radiation from pieces of the satellite and co-operated by remaining well away from the scene.

6. One of the D.N.D. personnel who accompanied Cst. R.P. REINHARDT and Cst. W.B. OTTMANN on this particular patrol was Sgt. J.M. GRADY, the Intelligence Sergeant for N.R.H.Q. in Yellowknife, N.W.T. He contacted me personally on 6 FEB 78 informing me that he was also a qualified Instructor for the Military Arctic Indoctrination Course. The basic requirements for a participant are the use of the equipment, setting up of the equipment and the maintenance of same. Sgt. GRADY stated that both Cst. REINHARDT and Cst. OTTMANN had qualified and proven themselves capable of being a recipient of this particular certificate. He further suggested that the Force should make a request to the N.R.H.Q. and then he could issue these two members with a Certificate to show that they had successfully completed this course. It is therefore recommended that such an application be made to the Officer Commanding N.R.H.Q.

7. Reference the Memorandum from the Officer i/c Admin. & Personnel dated 9 FEB 78, please find attached a breakdown of the costs which have been incurred by the Members of this Detachment to date.
