We have known com. Petro Volodka as a leading worker and builder of the Workers' Benevolent Association of long standing. We have known him to be a steadfast fighter for the cause of the working class.

We bow our heads before the grave and remains of our dear and unforgettable Comrade, Petro Volodka. From the bottom of our hearts we express our deep condolences to the wife and all relatives and friends of com. P. Volodka. We express our comradely condolences to your branch and all the members who have so early and unexpectedly lost their comrade and leader. We appeal to all members of your branch to rally closely around their executive committee and strive to fill with new members the big vacancy left by com. Petro Volodka. "We received a report on the election of a new secretary of your branch, com. D. Slotyuk. We are very glad that you took steps so soon to appoint a new secretary who will be able to settle your branch affairs with the NEC, WBA.

In this letter we are sending you a monthly statement, prepared for October and November. We sent a statement for October to the late com. Petro Volodka and that is where it should be; however, in case it was lost, make use of this new statement and try to collect all unpaid dues. The statement shows that nearly all members of your branch are in arrears for two or more months. It would be very good if all members of your branch pay up their dues to the end of the year. The books in the Central office are balanced early in December and it is hoped for this reason that each member straightens out his dues.

Two members of your branch, namely: Stella Muzichin and Ivan Hasyuk, have dues unpaid for 11 months, including November. Try to persuade them to straighten out their dues and retain their rights in the WBA. Perhaps these comrades wish to have more and better coverage from the new plans. If so, let them choose whichever policy they want, and WBA insurance in the new plans, and we will give them partial credit for their old policies, upon payment of the first dues. Discuss it with them and write us about their wishes.

All members who have very little coverage, may transfer to new plans and increase their insurance. For the old policies they will receive the refund they are entitled to in cash.

It is known to you that our Association is now conducting a campaign for new members. Try to recruit at least two new members into your branch also, and keep all the old members.

"There are two branches of the AUUC in Cape Breton; one in Sydney and one in Glace Bay, N.S. They were taken over by the AUUC from the now defunct U.L.F.T.A. The majority of the members belonging to these branches are Ukrainians with a couple of Poles and Slavs also being members. These radical Slavs fell away from the Church shortly after their arrival in Canada and in most cases they have belonged to local radical organizations for the past thirty years or more. Both of these branches have their own halls - the Sydney branch on Mount Pleasant Street and the Glace Bay branch on Beacon street.

Also meeting in these halls are branches of the Workers Benevolent Association to which the majority of these radicals belong.

Prior to the last war these branches had large and active memberships and did a lot of work for the parent bodies. They were used mostly to raise funds for various leftist organizations and activities and for the size of the branches they did very well. Funds were raised through holding social affairs in private homes, dances in the halls, picnics during the summer months, staging concerts and canvassing for donations. In addition to this these branches were used by the radical movement for the various purposes: Obtaining signatures to any petition sponsored by the Reds, endorsing resolutions sent in by Red dominated organizations and the steelworkers among them were used to pack regular meetings of the steel union and put through decisions favourable to the Reds. (This phase of activity was used when George McEachern was an active member of the steel union.)

During the war years these branches remained rather quiet as most members feared internment and after the war their activities never came up to what they were in previous years. Disagreement amongst themselves, brought on by self-criticism of fellow members was the chief reason for the disintegration of what once was a well organized group of people. This can be seen from the fact that when the parent body of the AUUC sent in a resolution for endorsement this resolution was endorsed and signed by Steve Kowalski and Peter Wolodka, Secretary and Treasurer of the Sydney branch of the AUUC, which stated that a meeting on January 1st, 1950 had endorsed the resolution when in reality no meeting had been held at all. This resolution protested the behaviour of a group of DPS who wrecked a meeting of the AUUC in Timmins recently.

Their most active member in Sydney, N.S., one Michael Oleschuk, received a bad scare last Spring during the CSU trouble when he was threatened physical violence by a group of anti-Red steelworkers who also threatened to throw him out of the steel plant. At this time Oleschuk decided to buy a farm in the event that he was thrown out of employment. This farm is not far from the City but Oleschuk is kept busy after working on the steel plant all day and in working on the farm on his days and nights off which leaves him no time for any other kind of activity.

The following people are the only ones who show any interest in the AUUC branch in Sydney, N.S.: Steve Kowalski, Peter Wolodka, Steve Andruszysn, Sam Kolynich, John Hawrylak and Mike Oleschuk. Meetings are seldom held and most of the activities for some time past has been the officers or executive of the Sydney branch canvassing members for payment of dues.

From information received it is believed that the same condition exists in the Glace Bay branch of this organization.






