CANDIDATURES DISCUSSION : AGREED RECORD

Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND)

- Australia:** On 1991-94. Significant interest in continuing membership.
- Canada:** Candidate for 1992-95. Similarly interested in continued membership CND.
- New Zealand:** Not interested in making a bid in the short term.
- Agreed:**
- No difficulty in having concurrent Australia/Canada membership. Provided opportunity for New Zealand to run candidature if/when chooses;
 - Could consider CANZ rotational arrangement if CND enlarged and WEOG given two more seats.

Committee on Crime Prevention and Control (CCPC)

- New Zealand:** On 1987-90.
- Canada:** No interest in running candidature in short term.
- Australia:** May be interest in running again; will review in light of desirability of retaining CANZ membership.

Committee on Human Settlement (CHS)

- Canada:** Member since its establishment.
- Australia/
New Zealand:** Happy for Canada to retain membership.

Committee on Transnational Corporations (CTC)

- Canada:** Vacated seat in 1990. Not seeking re-election.
- Australia/
New Zealand:** No interest in membership. Australia may review.

International Narcotics Control Board (INCB)

- Australia:** Candidate for 1992-94 but not hopeful at chances of election. Candidate may withdraw.

International Working Group (IWG)

Canada: Ended term in 1990 and did not seek re-election.

Australia/

New Zealand: No interest in membership.

Population Commission

No current CANZ membership. (Canada member of the Prepcom for 1994 Population Conference and may consider bid for membership.) Recognised possible increasing importance of Commission as attention increased on Environment issues.

Statistical Commission

Canada: Serving term 1989-92.

Australia: Candidate for 1993-96.

Agreed: New Zealand should consider replacing Australia in 1997.

United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF)

Canada: Currently serving term 1990-92: interested in 'quasi' permanent membership.

Australia: Endorsed WEOG candidate for 1992-94. Interested in continuing membership bearing in mind need for CANZ rotation.

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)

Agreed: CANZ should continue to try to hold two seats concurrently. Present rotation working well.

Australia: Currently serving to end 1991.

Canada: Serving term 1989-91 and endorsed WEOG candidate for 1992-94.

New Zealand: Endorsed WEOG candidate 1992-94.

United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR)

Australia/

Canada: Both permanent members.

United Nations Research Institute for Social Development (UNRISD)

Canada: Serving term 1991-97. In absence of Australia/
New Zealand interest, Canada would envisage
continuing on this body.

World Food Programme (WFP)

Australia/
Canada: Currently serving terms to 1992.

Ad Hoc Group of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax
Matters

CANZ not currently represented. No intention to mount campaign
in foreseeable future.

Committee of Experts on Transport of Dangerous Goods

Canada: Currently provides one expert.

Security Council

New Zealand: Candidate for 1993-94.

Australia: Expected to mount candidature 1997-98.

Canada: Aims to seek membership every ten years.

Committee for Programme and Coordination (CPC)

Canada: Served to end 1990.

Australia: No interest in candidature as yet but looking at
it.

Advisory Committee on Administration and Budgetary Questions
(ACABQ)

No CANZ candidature at present but possibility of Canadian
interest for 1993. Similarly, depending on staff factor, may be
some Australian interest in future years.

ICSC

No CANZ candidature but possibility of Canadian interest at
UNGA 47 election.

Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC)

Noted that recent ECOSOC resolution on reform of that body might well have ramifications for size and distribution of membership which in turn may make it more difficult for CANZ to be represented as now.

Australia: Endorsed WEOG candidate for 1992-95.

New Zealand: Noted possible resource difficulty (with UNDP and Security Council commitments) in taking up previous CANZ invitation to take term 1993-95.

Canada: Expressed interest in its maintaining membership of ECOSOC and hoped that CANZ would/could continue to have two seats.

International Law Commission (ILC)

Canada: Currently serving to end 1991.

Australia: Running for 1992-96.

Australia provided Australia/New Zealand with paper on lobbying strategy to assist in support of Crawford's campaign. Noted that vote trading within WEOG would be critical. Question of enlisting reciprocal support from Nordics being investigated.

United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)

Noted agreed CANZ rotational arrangements for future.

Expect that Australian candidature for next term (1992-95) would face tough election.

World Food Council (WFC)

Australia: Endorsed WEOG candidate for re-election at UNGA 46 for 1992-94 term.

Canada: Currently serving 1991-93.

United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL)

Canada: Currently member to 1995.

Australia: To seek membership from 1995.

United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation
(UNESCO) Executive Board

Australia: Candidate for 1992-93, with New Zealand support.

Canada: To check on their voting position.

United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) 46th Session : Fifth
Committee Chair

Australia: Withdrawn candidature (Peter Gregg) from UNGA 46
to enable WEOG (FRG) to hold 3rd Committee
chair. Still under advisement should latter not
come through.

International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA)

Australia: Noted its candidature (Doug Townsend) for
Director External Relations IAEA.

CANZ CONSULTATIONS, WELLINGTON : 14-15 MAY 1991

HUMAN RIGHTS ELECTIONS : AGREED SLATES

Commission on Human Rights (CHR)

Canada: Will seek re-election in 1991 for a 1992-94 term. Assured of Australia and New Zealand support.

Issue of a CANZ rotation should be addressed at the next consultations. New Zealand's intentions in future elections will be an important consideration. Australia would consider re-election when current term expires in 1993.

Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)

Australia: Will seek election for a 1993-96 term in elections in May 1992. Australia would also like to be member in 2000.

Canada: Remains on the CSW until 1992. Following a four year break it will stand for election for a 1997-2000 term.

New Zealand: Has no immediate interest in CSW elections.

Committee on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW)

New Zealand: Will advise Canada and Australia within a fortnight Minister's decision on whether to field a candidate in the January/February 1992 elections. Decision is likely to be negative.

Canada: Has a candidate and will stand for election in the event that the New Zealand decision is negative.

Australia: Justice Evatt will stand down at the end of 1992.

International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women (INSTRAW)

New Zealand: Expert is likely to stand for a second term, subject to Ministers' approval.

**Canada/
Australia:** No interest at this stage.

Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (CESCR)

Australia: Expert (Alston) elected for second term 1991-94.

Canada/

New Zealand: No interest at this stage.

Committee Against Torture (CAT)

Canada: Will seek re-election in 1991.

Australia/

New Zealand: No interest at this stage.

Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD)

New Zealand: Not able to nominate a suitably qualified and available candidate for the 1992 elections.

CANZ: ECOSOC - Notes

-At our last meeting two years ago, the issue of ECOSOC was contentious - CANZ members were reluctant to commit themselves to new terms ECOSOC although there are usually two CANZ seats. Finally after much arm-twisting, Canada agreed to renew its term on ECOSOC on the firm understanding that we would not run again and Australia would replace us at the end of our term. (New Zealand is currently also a member.)

Canadian position

-The end of our term is in sight (1992), Australia seems willing to take the place of either Canada or New Zealand, and we have made a decision we want to stay on ECOSOC because it is so valuable in electoral terms. Australia and New Zealand have been told that we are reviewing our former decision; we should make our new decision known at this meeting.

-Australia and New Zealand seem prepared to alternate with each other and allow us to stay on ECOSOC permanently so that there are always two CANZ seats. Perhaps we should make this clear.

REPORT TO CONGRESS ON
VOTING PRACTICES IN THE UNITED NATIONS

INTRODUCTION

By Ambassador Vernon A. Walters

This is the sixth annual report on the "comparison of the overall voting practices in the principal bodies of the United Nations", submitted to Congress pursuant to Public Law 100-461 and PL 98-164. As required by law, it is identical in format with previous reports. Preparation of this report requires close collaboration between the Secretary of State and the Permanent Representative to the United Nations.

The purpose of the report is to provide a guide to voting patterns of individual member states in multilateral forums. This is one benchmark for assessing the approach of United Nations member states to issues before the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) and the Security Council.

The actions of member states in the UN are important to the United States because debates and decisions of the UNGA and the Security Council often significantly affect major United States foreign policy interests. Although UNGA resolutions and decisions are not, with limited exceptions, legally binding on member states, they largely determine the policies of constituent UN bodies, focus world attention on some problems while deflecting it from others, generally reflect the priorities of member states with respect to international issues, and are interpreted as the view of the international community on such issues.

The voting record of member states in the UNGA, however, is but one dimension of each member's relationship with the United States. Bilateral economic, defense and political issues often are more important to U.S. interests and policies. Nevertheless, because a number of decisions taken by UN bodies significantly affects these interests, the positions taken by a member state at the United Nations should be considered when assessing the state of its overall relationship with the United States.

OVERVIEW

The improved relationship between the United States and the Soviet Union was a major factor responsible for a productive 43rd UNGA session. Several actions of the United Nations itself also helped set the stage. In April 1988, the Secretary-General and his representative successfully concluded the Geneva Accords which provided for the withdrawal of Soviet military forces from Afghanistan. The Security Council played a major role in halting the conflict between Iran and Iraq in August 1988. In September it was announced that the United Nations Peacekeeping Forces had won the Nobel Peace Prize.

The 43rd Session of the General Assembly adopted a total of 383 resolutions and decisions. Of these, 245 (64.0%) were adopted by consensus. In addition there were 28 recorded votes on individual paragraphs of resolutions or on procedural questions. Among the major issues debated by the 158 member states at the 43rd UNGA and on which the General Assembly adopted resolutions were the Soviet invasion and continued occupation of Afghanistan, the Vietnamese occupation of Cambodia, the Arab-Israeli conflict, apartheid, Namibia, arms control, human rights in various member states, economic development, and the organization's biennial budget and internal administration.

According to the required methodology, the overall level of "voting coincidence" with U.S. Yes or No votes of the other Member States at the 43rd General Assembly was only 15.4%. Nevertheless, as is described in detail below, U.S. foreign policy interests were significantly advanced at the 43rd session of the General Assembly.

As I have previously cautioned the Congress, the statistical system used to measure voting patterns, as required by law, does not give a comprehensive or accurate picture of the results of General Assembly sessions. In this connection, I note that the 100th Session of the United States Congress amended section 527(c) of the Foreign Operations, Export Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 1989 (Public Law 100-461) because of its concerns about the methodology. ||

It is useful to recall some of the problems with the methodology. First, the data used to determine the overall level of "voting coincidence" with the United States are drawn only from recorded votes and exclude the large number of resolutions and decisions, many of great importance to the United States, adopted by consensus. Therefore, the "voting coincidence" statistics are based on a minority of UNGA

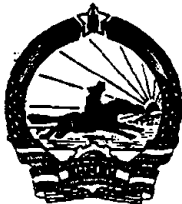
The Philippine Government would therefore appreciate the valuable support of the Canadian Government for this candidature.

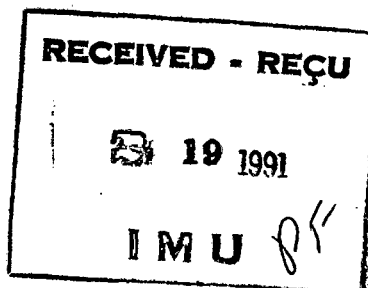

Commission on Narcotic Drugs (E/1991/L.1)

Twenty members are to be elected for a term of four years, beginning on 1 January 1992. The Council, in its resolution 1983/5, decided to enlarge the membership of the Commission to 40, taking into account the special criteria used in electing members of the Commission and keeping the actual percentage. These criteria were specified by the Council in resolution 845 (XXXII), by which the Council decided that the members of the Commission would be elected (a) from among the States Members of the United Nations and members of the specialized agencies and the parties to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961; (b) with due regard to the adequate representation of countries which were important producers of opium or coca leaves, of countries which were important in the field of the manufacture of narcotic drugs and of countries in which drug addiction or illicit traffic in narcotic drugs constituted an important problem; and (c) taking into account the principle of equitable geographical distribution.

Nomination of members of the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (E/1991/L.8)

Seven members are to be nominated by the Council, in accordance with Council resolution 2008 (LX), for election by the General Assembly at its forty-sixth session to fill the vacancies in the Committee that will occur on 31 December 1991. The term of office is three years, beginning on 1 January 1992. The vacancies are to be filled according to the following pattern:

One member from Asian States;

Committee on Food Aid Policies and Programmes (E/1991/L.7)

Five members are to be elected from among States Members of the United Nations or members of the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations, for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1992, taking into account the need for balanced representation of economically developed and developing countries and other relevant factors, such as the representation of potential participating countries, both contributing and recipient, equitable geographical distribution and the representation of both developed and developing countries having commercial interests in international trade in foodstuffs, especially those highly dependent on such trade.

Board of Trustees of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women

In accordance with article III of the statute of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women, the Board of Trustees consists of 11 members nominated by States and appointed by the Council with due regard to the fact that the Institute and its work are funded from voluntary contributions and to the principle of equitable geographical distribution. Members of the Board serve in their individual capacities for a term of three years and are eligible for appointment for one additional term.

The term of office of five members of the Board expires on 30 June 1991. Taking into account the existing de facto geographical balance of the Board endorsed by the Council at previous sessions, the Council is to appoint one member from African States, one member from Asian States, one member from Eastern European States, one member from Latin American and Caribbean States and one member from Western European and other States for a three-year term, beginning on 1 July 1991. The names of the candidates submitted by Governments and their curricula vitae will be before the Council.

Nomination of members of the World Food Council (E/1991/L.9)

In accordance with paragraph 8 of General Assembly resolution 3348 (XXIX), the Council will be called upon to submit nominations to the Assembly at its forty-sixth session to fill the 12 vacancies that will occur in the World Food Council on 31 December 1991. On the basis of the distribution of membership in the World Food Council decided upon by the Assembly, the elections at the forty-sixth session will be held according to the following pattern:

Committee for the United Nations Population Award

In accordance with article 4 of the Regulations Governing the United Nations Population Award, adopted by the General Assembly (see resolution 36/201, annex), the Council is to elect 10 representatives of States Members of the United Nations for a period of three years, with due regard to the principle of equitable geographical representation and the need to include those Member States that have made contributions for the Award. The rules of procedure of the Committee for the United Nations Population Award are set out in Council decision 1982/112.

At its resumed second regular session of 1982, the Council agreed that, without prejudice to the principle of equitable geographical distribution, the seats would be distributed as follows: three seats for African States, two and a half seats for Asian States and Latin American States (the distribution to be determined by those two groups themselves, on the understanding that one group would have three seats and the other two, on a rotating basis); one seat for Eastern European States and one seat for Western European and other States (see E/1982/SR.54 and 58). The Council is therefore to elect the 10 members for a three-year term, beginning on 1 January 1992, according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States;

Three members from Asian States;

One member from Eastern European States;

Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

One member from Western European and other States.

Item 12. Consideration of the provisional agenda for the second regular session of 1991

61. In accordance with rule 9 of the rules of procedure of the Economic and Social Council, the draft provisional agenda for the second regular session of 1991 will be submitted to the Council for consideration, together with suggestions concerning the organization of the work of the session.
