
As you know, following your marriage to Robert Neff, a non Indian you were enfranchised by order of council PC/1953-139 on February 5th, 1953.

A short time after that we sent you a cheque for \$651.68, being your share of the Brunswick House Band fund and then shortly after that, April 1st, 1953, you received a cheque for \$80.00, representing your share of treaty nine annuity payable because of your enfranchisement.

At that time we we advised you as follows, quote "A cheque for [redacted] representing the child's share of the band fund, is being forwarded to the public trustee, Province of Ontario, for administration. The child's share of treaty money, in the amount of [redacted] will be forwarded to the public trustee on April 1st, 1953" In other words you have received all the money that is payable to you [redacted] Money is being held in trust, by the public trustee of the Province of Ontario.

I note in your letter that you tell me that if I do not do anything about this matter you are going to write to Ottawa about it. I might say you are completely at liberty to do so.

This office has not received a reply to our letters of March 19th/53 and May 11th/53, concerning the enfranchisement of Mrs. Dora (Frog) Neff.

It appears that the monies due to the child [redacted] have been sent to the Public Trustee. I have written to the Public Trustee in other cases of this nature and know that it is next to impossible if not entirely impossible to get any of this money for the use of the child before [redacted] is twenty one years of age. That is why we returned the cheque made out to Mrs. Neff in the hopes that part of it at least could be set aside in our trust account for administration for [redacted]. The whole matter of completing this enfranchisement is being held in abeyance pending direction from your office.



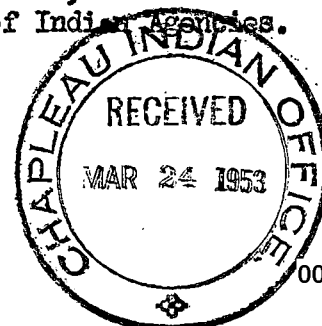

Dear Mrs. Neff:

I have for reply your letter of February 9th concerning your daughter [redacted] and the trouble you are having with [redacted]

First of all I wish to advise you that, if your husband is willing, it would be a good thing if he sent a little money now and again for the care of your child, say \$5.00 or \$10.00 per month; However, he should not send it to [redacted] but should send it to the Chapleau Indian office and we will see that it is properly spent for the child. I wish to make it clear that your husband is not under any obligation to pay for the care of this child at the present time. Any assistance he can give will be appreciated and properly used.

Secondly, your husband is under no obligation whatsoever to keep the rest of your family, and I shall very strongly advise [redacted] to stop writing such letters. [redacted]

With regard to you taking your child, I have to advise as follows: Since you have married Mr. Neff, who is a non-Indian, both your [redacted] and yourself will be automatically enfranchised and you will receive a fair amount of money from the Band funds for this. However, I am not particularly in favour of you taking your child to live with you, and [redacted] certainly could not go to you until you came out of the San, cured.

Also I would like to point out that by having [redacted] live with you and your husband, he might resent having to look after [redacted] and it could break up your marriage. However,

.....again I must point out that if you insist, on having your child when you are able to look after [REDACTED], I cannot stop you. I do feel that in the long run it would be wise for [REDACTED] to adopt the child and [REDACTED] and will receive a good education in our School on the Reserve.

When we were advised that the above noted Indian woman had left the Essex County Sanatorium without permission, we turned the matter over to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. Their Report on the case is as follows:


(1) They learned through Dr. Robertson, Superintendent of the Essex County Sanatorium, that Dora Frog is at present confined at the Howell Michigan Sanatorium, near Detroit.

(2) The United States Immigration Service do not anticipate any action as the woman is a Treaty Indian

Besides this report, we learned from [redacted] that Dora had run away from the San with Mr. Robert D. Neff, 1505 Ridge Road, P.T.A., Ypsilanti, Michigan, and that she was married to him. These developments have been reported to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and to Ottawa. This office has also written to Mrs. Neff requesting particulars of the whole episode

However, the police report notifies us that she is in Howell Sanatorium, Michigan. We do not know anything about her husband, but have written to find out what his status is.

Would you please advise whether or not Indian Health Services will accept accounts from Howell Sanatorium for her care.


