

Atomic Demolition Munitions (ADMs)
Canadian Army Interest

1. As you are aware, the present state of knowledge and training in Canada with respect to ADMs is most unsatisfactory. It is now considered necessary to begin training in the Canadian Army for the following reasons:

- a. In order to operate efficiently with US and British formations, both now training on ADMs.
- b. Because of the operational aspects of ADM employment planned in our area by others, for which 4 CIBG has some Engineer support responsibility.
- c. So that ADM employment can be quickly instituted if so directed.

2. You are requested, therefore, to approach the US Army on this matter, obtain and forward all available information, from UNCLASSIFIED to SECRET, on training for ADMs. This information should include, if possible:

- a. Principles and factors involved in training on and employment of ADMs.
- b. Applicable training precis and lesson plans.
- c. Details of training devices in so far as they can be made available.



ADMs - CE's Request

1. The "Agreement between Cda and the US for Cooperation on the Uses of Atomic Energy For Mutual Defence Purposes" dated 14 Jun 59 is permissive as you suggested in your minute of 24 Sep 63. Thus, Para 2 of the letter at flyleaf is not necessary because it adds nothing to the request for training information. It is axiomatic therefore that US Army will provide as much of this information as they are willing to release.

2. It was not visualized during discussions on the Cda/US Nuclear Agreement concerning the Storage of Nuclear Warheads, that 4 CIBG would have a requirement for ADMs. This view is supported by the Brigade's current role in the NORTHAG EDP. Consequently, Annex "A" to the Nuclear Agreement made no provision for ADMs. Notwithstanding, I can see no reason why the Cdn Army and, in particular the RCE Sqn Comd with 4 CIBG, should not carry out as much training as possible on ADMs. For this reason, I support the CE's request to obtain training information on ADMs to the extent possible.

3. DEP have been consulted and agree that with the deletion of para 2, the letter at flyleaf, represents the best approach.



Atomic Demolition Munitions

1. Reference is made to the discussion of ADMs at the VCGS Conference 5 Sep 63 and my memorandum HQS 8933-8-3 (CE) dated 26 Jul 63 hereunder.
2. We have no wish to have the nuclear agreement with US amended in order to provide material or data on ADMs. What we require is information, excluding Restricted Data, that will permit us to train engineer commanders and troops on the uses and employment of ADMs. We also need training models of ADMs. These models need not contain any working parts that might be of a Restricted Data nature, but should be of the approximate size and configuration of the actual ADM.
3. I feel it is essential that this training begin as soon as possible and therefore I would request you to again approach the VCGS with a view to signing the letter to CAS(W) which is attached as the flyleaf.

Atomic Demolition Munitions (ADMs)

1. Reference is made to the memoranda of even file at Flags A and B.

2. Paragraph 7 of CSC Paper No 1/63 states that the Canadian Armed Forces should develop knowledge of the potential of nuclear weapons so that the capability of their employment can be quickly instituted if so directed. Regardless of whether or not the RCE use ADMs, there is no doubt in my mind that, if a nuclear war occurs, the Corps or higher commander will use these weapons in the Canadian area. For the RCE commander to carry out his role as advisor to the Canadian Bde or Div Comd on ADMs, and to ensure that the RCE is proficient in their use, I consider we must now begin training on these weapons.



These notes provide information as to why ADMs will be essential in a nuclear war.

While both classified and unclassified US Army field and training manuals relating to ADMs are held by the Canadian Army, considerable other training literature and aids are used by the Corps of Engineers, US Army. It would be most desirable to obtain these, as they have been prepared by the experts. This would also eliminate the possibility of a security violation in using precis and lesson plans prepared from material extracted from classified pamphlets.

5. I would request that the VCGS be again approached and asked to direct CAS(W) to obtain from the US Army, as much information as possible on training in ADMs. A letter to CAS(W) for the VCGS signature is attached.

3. FM101-31-1 and FM101-31-3, Nuclear Weapons Employment, contains certain information on NDA and contains unclassified tables for ADWT Tgt analysis for yield of .5KT, 1KT, 5KT, 10KT, 50KT and 100KT. Both manuals can be obtained on loan from DHT/HTSB. These manuals have been ordered for distribution within the Army and both the GC's office and RCSE have been included in the ^{planned} distribution.

- b. FM 101-31-2, Nuclear Air Support Employment, is a 'ZED' list manual which contains ADM Lt analysis tables for actual speeds. These manuals have been requested from US through DEPT and will be on a very limited distribution.
- c. TH 3-210, Fallout Prediction, is the latest manual on fallout prediction. This nuclear effect must be considered when using ADMs. The manual is available, on loan, from DHT/HRSB.
- d. FM 55-26, Employment of ADMs, is a 'ZED' list manual available from DEPT to officers on the 'ZED' List. It would appear to contain the type of information you require.
2. It is suggested that you:
- a. Review the manuals available and decide what additional information is required.



1. Reference is made to my memorandum of even file at Flag A.
2. Paragraph 7 of CSC Paper No 1/63 states that the Canadian Armed Forces should develop knowledge of the potential of nuclear weapons so that the capability of their employment can be quickly instituted if so directed. For RCE to carry out its role in so far as nuclear weapons are concerned, I consider that we must begin training on the use of ADMs. Regardless of the policy on the use of these weapons at this time, there is no doubt in my mind that if a nuclear war occurs RCE will be called upon to use ADMs.

These notes provide further information as to why ADMs will be essential in a nuclear war.

4. RCE must be as proficient in the use of ADMs as RCA is in the use of other nuclear weapons and thus we should begin training on the same basis as the Artillery. I would request that the VCGS be again approached and asked to contact CAS(W) to obtain as much information on ADMs as possible from the United States Army. A letter to CAS(W) for the VCGS signature is attached.

Atomic Demolitions Munitions (ADM) Training

1. Reference is made to our letter of even file dated 26 Nov 62 a copy of which was sent to you for information.
2. Enclosed is a set of ten unclassified photographs of training versions of equipment employed by the US Army in this field. While the photographs themselves are unclassified details as to actual items they represent in the way of yield, weights, firing options etc constitute RESTRICTED DATA (RD). Annex 'A' attached describes in brief terms the item in each photograph. RD information, of course is not available to the Canadian Army.
3. It may be of interest to note that requests have been made from several sources in the US Army for preparation and publication of additional, unclassified, detailed field manuals on ADM and related procedures. This has been resisted in turn within the US Army principally by elements of Combat Developments Command (CDC). The Engineer Agency of CDC (USACDCEA) makes the following point in support of this resistance:

"The preparation of DA publications by USACDCEA is guided by principles given verbally by CG CAG 29 Nov 62 as follows:

"Manuals should provide a broad and general technical base for field use and operations rather than provide detailed, step by step guidance to the platoon or squad commander. Implementing operating procedures, techniques, etc should be prepared by the overseas commander in the form of local manuals, SOPs or command plans in support of the operational plans and missions."

4. In further rebuttal of the need for additional unclassified, detailed manuals in this field reference is made to FMs 101-31-1 and 101-31-3 of Feb 63. Copies of these two FMs were forwarded with our

Atomic Demolition Munitions

1. The introduction of the Atomic Demolition Munitions (ADMs) into the US Army represents a major breakthrough in the ability of their engineers to carry out major demolitions quickly and efficiently on the nuclear battlefield. Research and development is now believed to be virtually complete on the first generation of ADMs and to be progressing toward a second generation of more efficient equipments.

In the tactical use of ADMs, the current US situation appears to be as follows:

② CE (thru DGMT)

- a. ADMs have been issued to engineer field units.
- b. Units have been trained in their handling and employment.
- c. The doctrine for their employment has been published and distributed.
- d. Commanders and staffs make use of simulated ADMs in training and on exercises as a normal part of their nuclear arsenal.

3. The same situation prevails in the British Army, although not to the same extent.

4. To date very little official information has become available to the Canadian Army due to the security classification of the US information, most of which has been handled as Restricted Data. As a result, no engineer training has been carried out, and no realistic "play" of ADMs in TEWTs and exercises has been possible.

5. However, it is my understanding that a considerable amount of useful US information on doctrine, employment and training could now be made available to the Canadian Army on request, apart from the Restricted Data to which, of course, we are still denied access.

- a. RCE technical training on the handling, emplacement and employment of ADMs, and
- b. all-arms training so that ADMs may be introduced into TEWTs, exercises, concentrations, etc.

7. Signature of the attached letter to the Commander, Canadian Army Staff (Washington) requesting him to obtain all available information, is therefore recommended.
