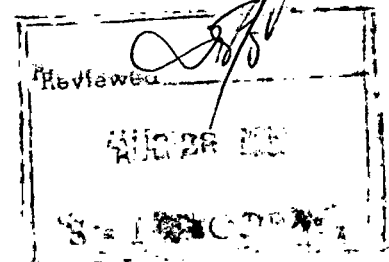



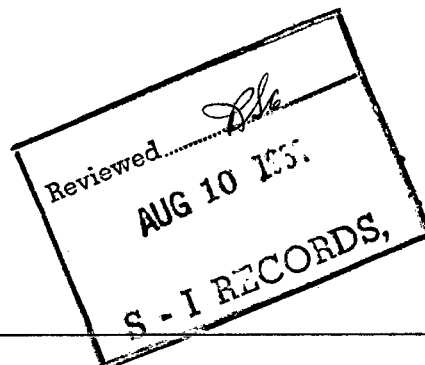

1. [redacted] there is no organized AUUC in this area at the present time, and there haven't been any meetings or social activities held by this organization for the past 3 or 4 years, [redacted]

2. [redacted] the following persons are likely supporters of the AUUC in the Glace Bay - Sydney N.S. area,

John EVASUK  
Mike SALYZYN  
Michael OLESCHUK  
William HAWRYLUK

[redacted] has not heard of any particular activity by this group for some time.

3. [redacted] advised that the AUUC in both Sydney and Glace Bay is no longer organized or holds regular meetings, however a few of the more enthusiastic supporters, such as William HAWRYLUK, John EVASUK and Mike SALYZYN, still try to raise funds for the parent body and its publications. One of the methods of raising funds, which is presently in use, is by selling raffle tickets on an article which they purchase locally. When these raffles are in progress one of the mentioned men will usually be found at #1 Gate of the Sydney Steel Plant, selling tickets to the steelworkers. [redacted] does not know where the tickets are printed nor does he know who actually runs the raffle.

- ✓ 2. [REDACTED] Dymtro SLOTIUK [REDACTED], Steve ANDRUSYSHYN [REDACTED], William HAWRYLUK [REDACTED], Michael MUZUCZYSHYN [REDACTED], Mike OLESCHUK [REDACTED], and Teofil ORKISH [REDACTED] were the only persons in this area [REDACTED] connected with the A.U.U.C.
