



The late Felix Wilson died intestate on the 8th of July, 1956, leaving as his heirs and next of kin his two daughters Delia George and Bertha Wilson and his three sons Samuel, Leslie and Gus or August Wilson. The assets in his estate consist of two parcels of land, first the South portion of Lot 93 under Certificate of Possession 6962; second, the Northern part of Lot 105 which he acquired from the estate of Samuel Wilseem, your file 9152-131; there is also \$60.00 in the Department to the credit of this estate according to your form letter dated the 23rd April, 1957, on file 9152-237(Est.10) which is made up of an Old Age Assistance cheque of \$20.00 and an Old Age Security cheque of \$40.00.

The funeral expenses have been paid in full from a Band collection; no reimbursement is expected in this regard.

Leslie, Gus and Mrs. Delia George have all been advised that they should come to some agreement about the ownership of the land in the estate. They said they would talk it over and would return to the office when they have made their decision.

This will acknowledge your Application for Administration of the Felix Wilson estate received here recently.

The old estate of Samuel Wilson was reviewed in connection with it, and we find that a considerable amount of work has been done to advance it to a conclusion. We note that an approved Band Council Resolution dated February 10th, 1957, confirms the two heirs of Samuel Wilson, Felix and Frank Wilson, in their ownership of the lands devised to them. Their Agreement dated August 2nd, 1916, wherein they divide the estate property has also been approved.

Subsequently, Felix Wilson was issued Location Ticket No. 6962 for his holding in the south half of Lot No. 93, but Location Tickets were not issued to cover the other parcels of land. As rivers form one boundary of each of these parcels our problem is to get a legally correct and workable description of these areas. In order that we may request proper L.T.S. Plans from the Survey Section, will you please give us the distance from the north west corner of Lot No. 105 to the point where the line begins that divides the north half of this lot into the parts held by Frank and the estate of Felix Wilson.

As soon as we receive this information from you, we will request L.T.S. plans, and endeavour to issue Certificates of Possession to those entitled to receive them upon receipt of an Agreement of Heirs.



Reference is made to your letter of April 29th, 1955, your file 152/P-3-0 (E). We regret in delaying our reply to you, however, you will realize that the division of this land required some investigation. According to the sketch we have Frank Wilson accepts all that portion of Lot #94 lying south of Slarlwus Creek, Felix Wilson all that portion of Lot #93 lying south of that Creek and then these two Indians are dividing that portion of Lot #105 lying north of the Koksilah River into portions in the ratio of 3.5:4.5.

Our difficulty is first with respect to Lot #105. In order to cancel Location Ticket #518 we have to account for the north half of this lot. It is difficult to tell whether the Koksilah River divides this lot into equal portions and from a legal point of view we should assume this. We also have a similar problem as to Lot #94 which is not under Location Ticket. The Council of the Band in their resolution were giving Frank Wilson the south half estimated to contain 7 acres. It would have been better if the description read as "All that portion lying south of the Slarlwus Creek". However, to straighten these controversies out could you obtain a statement from Felix and Frank Wilson to the effect that they have no interest in those portions of Lots Nos. 93 and 94

lying north of the Slarlwus Creek and that their interest in Lot #105 is to that portion of the lot lying north of Koksilah River. Upon receipt of this statement we will endeavour to issue Certificates of Possession to them.

These two brothers were in this office recently and agreed that the property is to be divided in accordance with the agreement signed by them dated August 2nd, 1919 and as per council resolution of February 10, 1951. We wish to further clarify the situation, as follows, and as per sketch attached:-

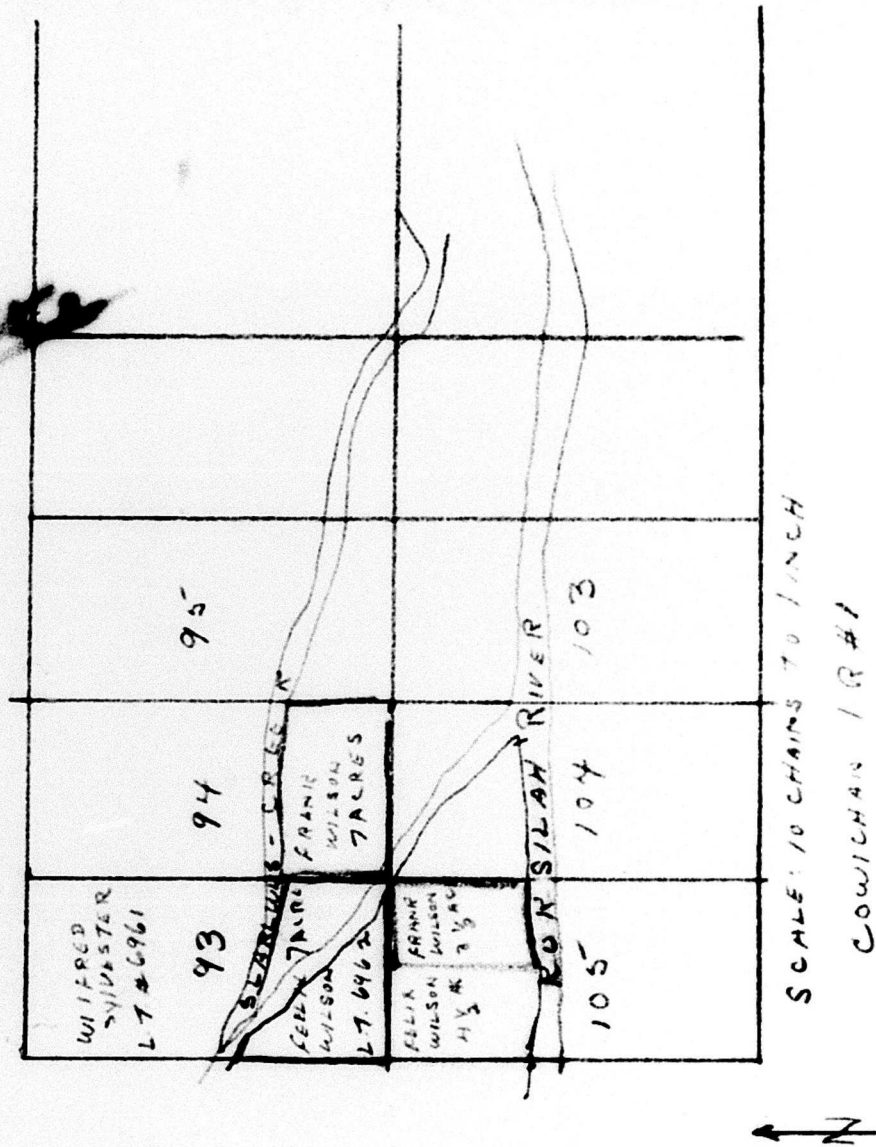
- Lot 93 - Felix Wilson holds C.P. #6962 covering 7 acres of the southern portion.
- Lot 94 - It is requested Frank Wilson be issued with a Certificate of Possession covering approximately 7 acres more or less lying south of Starvas Creek.
- Lot 105- The area lying north of the Koksilah River only is part of this estate, comprising approximately 8 acres. It is requested that Felix Wilson be supplied with a Certificate of Possession covering approximately $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres being the west portion while Frank Wilson be allotted approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres, being the east portion.

It is hoped the above information, with the sketch as a guide, will provide the required information to have the entire matter settled.

1. As Frank Wilson has already gone to the U.S. and will not return before the end of September, so far as is known now, no action can be taken.
 2. You will, I hope, realise that the physical features of the Cowichan I.R. #1 has changed in many places during the past 30 years on account of river erosion and channel changes. Certainly it is not the same as the plan, anywhere along the river flats. I'll admit the description of the document dated August 2, 1919, is not the best, but any new one that may be drawn up now will be entirely different.
 3. The suggestion you make for a division of the property will be carried out.

On April 25, 1952 you were advised that Certificates of Possession will be issued to Felix and Frank Wilson covering property in lots 93, 94, 105 which they have inherited from the estate of Samuel Wilson.

Reviewing our files and records we find it somewhat difficult to follow the description of these three parcels of land and even more complicated following the division as agreed between Felix and Frank.

Referring to the description as contained in Location Ticket No. 318, the land involved is described as N. 1/2 of Lot 105 regardless where the Kakilah river crosses the said lot. Examining the plan, it appears that the line dividing the lot into north or south half lies south of the said river. Regarding lots 93 and 94, the deceased apparently claimed all those portions lying south of the creek as shown on the plan. If the location of the creek with regards to the boundaries of the lots is correct, then it would appear that the acreage varies between the two lots.

The late Samuel Wilseem Glenclermaluts Band, died testate 10 March 1895. Assets in his estate are as set out in your application. There are no debts in this estate.

Resolution of Council dated 10 February 1951, has been approved, and also the agreement of the heirs dated 2 August 1919.

We will advise you under separate cover if Certificates of Possession can now be issued according to the agreement and the Resolution of Council.

This concludes the administration of the Samuel Wilseem Estate.

It is hereby mutually agreed between us, Felix Wilseem and Frank Wilseem, Indians of the Clemclemaluts Band, Cowichan Reserve.

That the following devision of our land left to us by our father, Samuel Wilseem, being parts of Lots Nos. 93, 94, and 105, as shown on official sub-division plan of Cowichan Reserve. That is to say that Felix will give to Frank a part of the east half of the timber land on Lot 105, north of the Koksilah river and south of the cleared land, but Felix shall retain one acre more of this timber land than Frank shall receive.

And land on Lots Nos 93 and 94, shall be divided equally between Felix and Frank. Felix to have the western portion, and Frank the eastern portion. The land to be surveyed an measured and divided.

The above was agreed to, in the presence of Chief George Queechquolt, Louie Underwood, and Johnny Page, all being present.



According to his Will, the deceased divided his property between two sons, Frank and Philip, who is now known as Felix, and his daughter Anny, who died without issue about forty-two (42) years ago. The other heirs, Seisa Joe and Madelina Wilson predeceased Anny, so that Felix and Frank Wilson are the only remaining heirs.

On August 2nd, 1919, Felix and Frank Wilson agreed to a division of the land as per document attached, witnessed by Indian Agent, Robertson. Why this was not reported to the Department at that time, I do not know. This division has existed to this date and is confirmed by the Cowichan Band Council Resolution attached.

Felix Wilson already has a location ticket covering the South half of Lot 93 (See location ticket No. 6963) and I would request that location tickets covering the South half of Lots 94 and 105 be issued.


