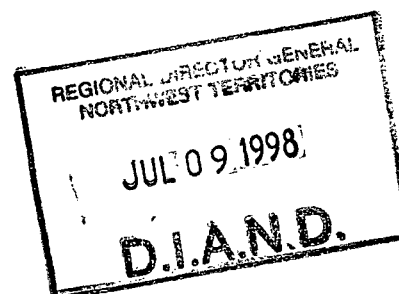

Pursuant to sub-section 7(1) of the *Atomic Energy Control Regulations*, the Deputy Minister of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (hereinafter "the licensee") is hereby licensed to possess the prescribed substances at the former mining site (commonly known as Rayrock Mine) located at Sherman Lake, Northwest Territories, and more particularly described in documentation referenced in Appendix "A" to this licence.

The licensee shall:

1. complete the remediation activities associated with the licensed areas at the former mining site according to the methods and procedures described in the documents listed in Appendix "A" to this licence, subject however to any other condition of this licence;
2. neither modify nor deviate from the methods, procedures and purposes described in the documents listed in Appendix "B" without the prior written approval of the Atomic Energy Control Board (hereinafter "the Board");
3. ensure that the maximum permissible doses of ionizing radiation and exposures to radon daughters set out in Schedule II of the *Atomic Energy Control Regulations* (hereinafter "the Regulations") are not exceeded as a result of the conduct of the licensed activities, but notwithstanding the permissible doses in the Regulations, keep doses of ionizing radiation and exposures to radon daughters any person receives as a result of the conduct of the licensed activities as low as reasonably achievable, taking into account relevant social and economic factors;
4. forthwith, once information indicates that a person may have received a dose in excess of the maxima referred to in Condition 3 for that person:
 - a) inform the person and the Board of the information,

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- b) investigate the validity of the information and the cause and circumstances leading to that person's receipt of the dose of ionizing radiation,
 - c) report the results of the investigation to the Board, and
 - d) comply with any corrective measures the Board may require;
5. ensure that every person working at the site receives instruction, in a manner that is satisfactory to the Board, in respect of health, safety and the environmental procedures that are described in the documents listed in Appendix "B";
6. ensure that records kept pursuant to paragraph 11(1)(c) of the Regulations are issued to the workers as those records pertain to that worker, within 60 days of the dosimetry period approved by the Board, and all these records are submitted to the Board within 60 days after the dosimetry period;
7. not later than February 28 of each year, submit to the Board an annual report, as of December 31 of the preceding year, summarizing the conditions observed during any visits/inspections to the site by Indian and Northern Affairs Canada or their representatives;
8. submit a long-term environmental monitoring program by November 30, 1999 for approval by the Board;
9. submit a final pathway analysis by March 1, 2000 for approval by the Board;
10. inform all persons involved in the conduct of the licensed activities of all licence conditions;
11. prominently display this licence or a copy thereof wherever the licensed activities are conducted;
12. have sufficient qualified personnel in attendance to ensure, at all times, the safe conduct of the activities authorized by the licence;
13. ensure that all persons while engaged in the conduct of the licensed activities wear appropriate protective apparel;
14. prohibit eating, drinking, smoking and the storage of food, beverages and smoking materials in all areas where the licensed activities are conducted; and

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15. ensure that all persons involved in the conduct of the licensed activities thoroughly wash before handling food or beverages.

This licence comes into effect June 30, 1998 and unless sooner suspended or revoked, expires June 30, 2000.
