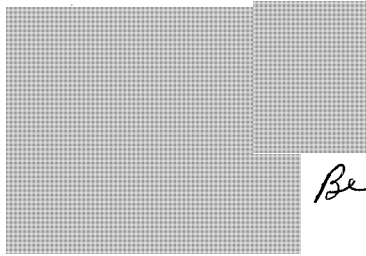

RUSSIAN SPY FLOWN HOME TO CANADA

PROF HUGH HAMBLETON, serving a 10-year sentence in Britain for selling Nato secrets to the Russians, was flown out of the country last night in an unannounced move by the Home Office.

Hambleton 63, a Canadian, who was sentenced at the Old Bailey in December 1982, flew from Heathrow to Toronto under a new repatriation of prisoners scheme.

He will complete his sentence in a Canadian prison so that he can be near his 95-year-old mother whose health is causing concern.

Hambleton, an economics professor who once dined with Yuri Andropov, the late Russian leader and former head of the KGB, was serving his sentence at Gartree Prison, Leicestershire, but was transferred to Wandsworth Prison in preparation for the move.

Under the repatriation scheme, introduced last August, Hambleton or a member of his family will have to pay the £280 air fair to Canada, but the Home Office will foot the bill for his escort, believed to be a Royal Canadian Mounted Police officer.

Nato Secrets

When the professor was jailed by Mr Justice Groom-Johnson it was claimed he had been in contact with Russian agents for 30 years. He had passed on thousands of vital Nato documents including military secrets.

He was described as a "major spy," and one security official said the professor had "undermined the very fabric of Nato for five years."

Hambleton claimed during the trial, which lasted for seven days, that he had worked as a double agent for both France and Canada, but the Attorney-General, Sir Michael Havers, QC, told the court: "There is no question of this man's ever being a double agent."

"Allegations of member states of Nato running an agent, in view of the firm undertaking given by all member states, is of such gravity that it is essential to say those allegations have no justification at all, damaging no doubt as they were."

Written consent

The Council of Europe Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons provides for transfers between Britain, Sweden, France, Spain, Canada and the United States of convicted prisoners to serve their sentences in their own countries.

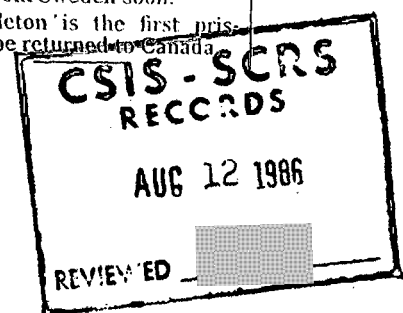
The prisoner has to apply and both countries concerned have to give their written consent.

The aim of repatriation is purely humanitarian, to enable prisoners to serve their sentences in their home countries where they can be visited by their relatives and friends.

A Home Office circular issued last year said that another reason for the transfer to a local prison was so that prisoners would not be "aggravated by problems of language, food and customs," and could better be prepared for a return to life in the community.

So far the only transfers under the scheme to this country have been from Sweden, with the return of Edwin Dent and Peter Malcolm, both sentenced for drug offences. A third prisoner is expected to return from Sweden soon.

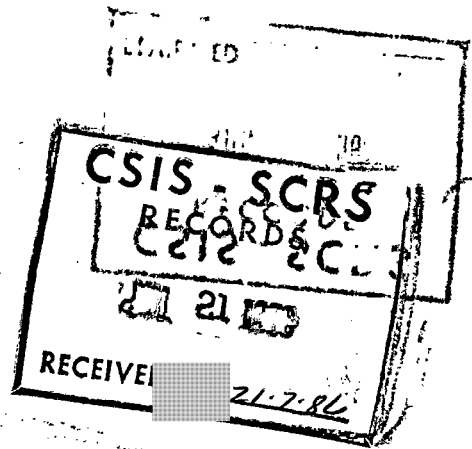

When the professor was jailed by Mr Justice Groom-Johnson it was claimed he had been in contact with Russian agents for 30 years. He had passed on thousands of vital Nato documents including military secrets.

He was described as a "major spy," and one security official said the professor had "undermined the very fabric of Nato for five years."

Hambleton claimed during the trial, which lasted for seven days, that he had worked as a double agent for both France and Canada, but the Attorney-General, Sir Michael Havers, QC, told the court: "There is no question of this man's ever being a double agent."

"Allegations of member states of Nato running an agent, in view of the firm undertaking given by all member states, is of such gravity that it is essential to say those allegations have no justification at all, damaging no doubt as they were."

Written consent

The Council of Europe Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons provides for transfers between Britain, Sweden, France, Spain, Canada and the United States of convicted prisoners to serve their sentences in their own countries.

The prisoner has to apply and both countries concerned have to give their written consent.

The aim of repatriation is purely humanitarian, to enable prisoners to serve their sentences in their home countries where they can be visited by their relatives and friends.

A Home Office circular issued last year said that another reason for the transfer to a local prison was so that prisoners would not be "aggravated by problems of language, food and customs," and could better be prepared for a return to life in the community.

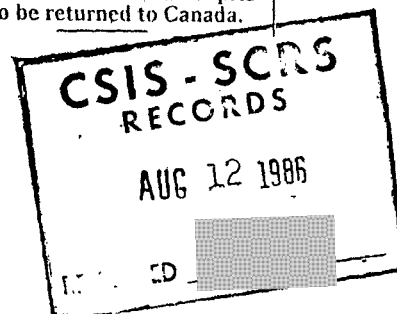
So far the only transfers under the scheme to this country have been from Sweden, with the return of Edwin Dent and Peter Malcolm, both sentenced for drug offences. A third prisoner is expected to return from Sweden soon.

Hambleton is the first prisoner to be returned to Canada.

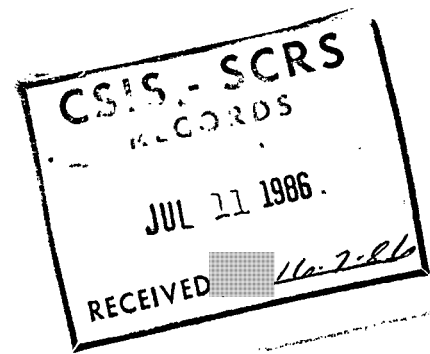

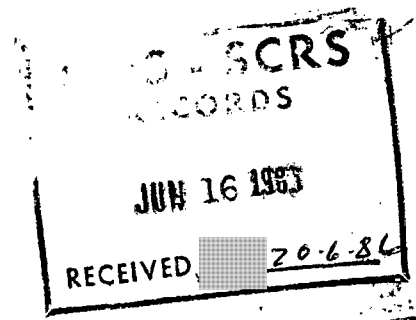
