1...."TWO DIFFERENT OCCASIONS". In view of recent decisions handed down by the Courts in that it is felt that the individual acts must be set out in the information, the informations were amended prior to 18-12-61. The informations now contain three distinct acts, the supplying of liquor, transporting the girls to Snag, and living in the same cabin without proper supervision.

2. On 18-12-61 the trial commenced before A.C.L. ADAMS, Police Magistrate. Prior to the start of the trial, it was agreed by both the defence and Crown counsels that the evidence would apply to both [redacted] and [redacted] in order that two trials would not be necessary. Cst. J.T. HERNDON was the first Crown witness and gave evidence as to finding the girls in the cabin and to returning them to Whitehorse. HERNDON also described the cabin and stated that upon his arrival there was no one at the shack other than [redacted] and the two girls. Defence did not cross examine this witness. The second Crown witness was [redacted] who gave evidence as to having been given beer by [redacted] in a motel room at Tourist Services Motel in the late evening of Oct. 8th. This witness also stated that the following day, Oct. 9th., she had been in a small shack inhabited by [redacted] and that this subject had given her wine. [redacted] also went on to state that she had travelled to Snag with both [redacted] and [redacted] and had lived in the same cabin with them up until the time she was picked up by Cst. HERNDON. [redacted] stated that neither accused had had sexual relations with her during this time. Cross examination of this witness, though lengthy, was quite irrelevant. Court was adjourned until 10:00 A.M., 19-12-61.

3. Court re-opened, and the first witness to appear this date was [redacted] gave evidence almost identical to that supplied by [redacted] as this subject had been present on both occasions when [redacted] was supplied with liquor. [redacted] did not have any of the liquor. This subject also related how the two accused had driven them to Snag and the conditions at the cabin. As in the case of the witness [redacted] cross examination was irrelevant. [redacted] took the stand as the next Crown witness and gave evidence as to having been present when [redacted] supplied [redacted] with beer and also when [redacted] gave the girl wine. There was no cross examination of this witness.

[redacted] appeared and gave evidence as to the two girls being students at the school and also as to their having run away from the school on 30-9-61. There was no cross examination. Mr. William GRANT, Indian Affairs Branch, Whitehorse, was the last witness called for the Crown. GRANT produced records proving the ages of both girls and also gave evidence to the effect that when any Indian children are attending either of the local hostels the principal of the hostel is regarded as being legal guardian of the child. 3.... "AND ALSO AS TO" his authority with respect to his statement that the principals of the hostels are recognized as the guardians of the children attending their respective schools. There was no further evidence submitted by the Crown and the defence declined to call any witnesses.

4. In summing up the Crown pointed out that all the ingredients of the charge had been proven and that it was quite obvious from the evidence submitted that [redacted] and [redacted] had contributed to the delinquency of the girls. Mr. REGHER began his summation by referring the Court to Sections 44 and 45 of the Juvenile Delinquents Act and stated that he had spent a considerable amount of time in the Law Library in an attempt to locate the required publication and that to his knowledge the Juvenile Delinquents Act had never been proclaimed in force in the Yukon Territory. REGHER also quoted a recent decision in British Columbia where a Magistrate had ruled that he was unable to take Judicial Notice of such a proclamation being in force in British Columbia and had dismissed a similar case under the Juvenile Delinquents Act. REGHER went into a lengthy harangue on this topic and when it was pointed out by the Magistrate that as he had been appointed a Juvenile Court Judge for the Yukon Territory four years ago he felt that a proclamation must have been issued and therefore definitely could be Judicially Noted, REGHER asked to see the Magistrate's appointment. After considerable discussion on this point Magistrate ADAMS stated that he was adjourning this trial until 9-1-62 and would hand down his decision at that time. Both Crown and defence counsels were instructed to conduct a little research on this matter and any points that they wished given consideration they were to submit to the Justice prior to 9-1-62.

5. An attempt was made to locate the Canada Gazette containing the required proclamation locally by both Crown Counsel and the writer without success. In view of this, a telex message was dispatched to "G" Division requesting a copy of Canada Gazette dated 4-12-48. The requested Gazette was received and a copy of same given to Magistrate ADAMS.

s.19(1) 1. On 24-August-61, Mr. R.H. JAMES reported to this office that the C.N.R. Freight Shed had been broken into. A patrol was made to the scene. Investigations revealed that entry had been gained by forcing the lock off of one of the side doors to the shed. At this time it could not be ascertained what had been removed. Mr. A.W. HUGHSON, a C.N.R. Investigator, later on this date informed me that 12 8½ oz. boxes of Nabisco's Shreddies had been taken. These boxes were in case #24 of a National Biscuit Co. shipment. Also one box of Shreddies was missing from another such case. Value of property stolen - \$3.50.

2. On 26-August-61 a number of small boys headed by [redacted] and [redacted] turned five of these boxes of Shreddies over to this office. They stated that they had found them in a plywood shelter they had located behind McRAE MOTORS, Prince Rupert, B.C. A patrol was made to this location. The case #24 of the National Biscuit Co. was found. This together with the five boxes of Shreddies are shown on attached Forms C.246. I found out that one [redacted] and a couple of his friends had frequented this area. All three, [redacted] are known by members of this detachment and were likely suspects.

3. On 27-August-61 [redacted] was questioned regarding this offence. He admitted his part in breaking and entering the premises and was subsequently arrested and lodged in the Detachment cells.

4. On 28-August-61 both [redacted] were interviewed and as a result were charged. It was agreed that they would appear voluntarily with their parents on 29-8-61.

5. On 29-August-61 [redacted] appeared in Juvenile Court and admitted Delinquency. ADJUDGED DELINQUENT on 29-8-61. Sentence suspended indefinitely and he was released in the custody of [redacted] his fosterfather. [redacted] acted as council for this youth and proved his age in court. This youth has no previous record at this detachment.

6. [redacted] did not appear on 29-8-61. On 1-9-61 he was arrested on a warrant. He appeared in Juvenile Court on this date and Admitted Delinquency. ADJUDGED DELINQUENT 1-9-61. Sentence was suspended indefinitely and he was released in the custody of his grand-father, [redacted], sworn, testified that he knew the age of the youth to be [redacted] years old. Neither the accused or his grand-father knew the exact date of birth. The accused has no previous record at this detachment.

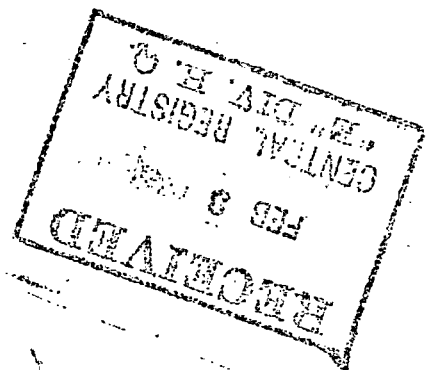

CONTINUED FROM C-264B..... SAFE, ON casters had been taken from the office of the building into the workshop where same had been attacked with acetylene cutting torch, drills, hammers and bars. The outside metal on the one side was cut out and efforts had been made to chisel out the concrete reinforcement. The dial was also knocked off and efforts had been made to pry off the hinges. Entry to the safe was not gained. [redacted] of the Machine Shop was immediately called to the scene as was Cst. NERKA of the Prince Rupert Sub/Div. Ident. Branch. An inventory revealed that nothing appeared to have been stolen.

2. Subsequent investigation led to a check of the Rex Cafe where [redacted] were located having breakfast. It was noted that their pants and shoes were covered with grey dust similar to that which had been chiseled from the safe, and their pants were also badly soiled with grease, apparently when in contact with the floor in the Machine Shop. Both boys were immediately taken into custody, pending further investigation, whereby it was learned that these two were responsible for the captionally noted offence. They were questioned in this regard and readily admitted to having committed this offence.

3. [redacted] upon appearing in Court, was dealt with as noted on Form C-264B. [redacted] appeared before R.A. McLEAN JJC on 10-11-60, having also been charged with the captionally noted offence. Upon application by the Crown, he was raised to Adult Court and was remanded in custody to 14-11-60. Form 12 J.D.A. was duly completed and signed by R.A. McLEAN JJC. Same is held on file at this Detachment. On 14-11-60 [redacted] appeared before B.T. APPELBAITE P/M. Elected trial by Magistrate and pleaded guilty. He was remanded for sentence to 22-11-60, at which time he was sentenced to serve nine months in gaol.

4. CHARGE NO. TWO: [redacted] whilst in custody on Charge No. one, admitted to having also entered the premises of the B.A. Oil Co. Office, but both stated that they hadn't taken anything. A phone call from the Manager of this establishment substantiated the admissions and subsequent investigation revealed that entry to the Office had been gained by breaking a rear window, and then by raising same after the catch had been unlocked. The office had been ransacked, but nothing appeared to have been taken. Cst. NERKA of the Ident. Branch was advised and attended at the scene.

5. [redacted] was charged accordingly and after appearing before Mag. B.T. APPELBAITE he was remanded until 14-11-60. At this time he elected trial by Magistrate and pleaded Guilty. He was remanded for sentence to 22-11-60 and on that date was sentenced to Two Years Imprisonment, concurrent to Charge No. One.

Both admitted that all this money had been stolen from the Standard Oil Co. and from Shell Oil Co., the latter being dealt with in Charge No. Two of this report. Entry to the building was gained by pulling forward on the Shop Sliding Door after the bottom slide board had been removed. A floor safe which had been removed from the office portion, was located in the Workshop, where same had been attacked and destroyed with acetylene cutting torch, chisels, drills and hammers. Entry was not gained.

2. Subsequent investigation revealed the captionally noted and one [redacted] having breakfast in the Rex Cafe. It was noted that their clothing was covered with concrete dust such as was contained as reinforcement in the Safe. They were taken into custody where a search of their persons revealed a total of \$18.00, mostly in silver. At this time they admitted to having attacked the Safe referred to in para. One and further admitted to having broken into the Standard Oil Co. premises, B.A. Oil Co. premises and the Shell Oil Co. premises on the same night, their total take having netted them the \$18.00 in their possession when taken into custody.

3. [redacted] further admitted to having broken into Tony's Drive Inn on 17-10-60 in which he took approximately \$40.00 from the Soft Drink Dispenser and some food from the stock room. He also admitted to breaking out of the Totem Grill on 7-11-60 after having taken the cash from the Wurlitzer Machine. An accomplice in this offence was one [redacted]. \$12.00 was taken from the Wurlitzer.

4. [redacted] appeared before P/M E.T. APPLEWHITE on 14-11-60 having been charged: THREE CHARGES B.E. & Theft, C.C. Sec. 292(1)b; TWO CHARGES: B. & E. with Intent, C.C. Sec. 292(1)a; ONE CHARGE: Breaking out after committing, C.C. Sec. 292(1)c. He pleaded guilty to all charges and was remanded for sentence to 22-11-60, at which time he was sentenced to Two Years Imprisonment on the first charge and Two Years (Concurrent) on each subsequent charge. 2. A complaint was received from Nelson Bros. cannery on the 6-9-60 at approx. 4:30PM stating that the cannery had been broken into sometime during the week-end. A patrol was made to the scene. It was noticed that the only possible ways into the cannery were through a number of small openings found at various points, and appeared as if the person(s) responsible were younger boys. These openings could be reached from beneath the cannery by anyone of a small stature. At first it appeared as if nothing was taken. The cannery was left in a mess with paper bags, rubber bands, and tools scattered all over the cannery. Printer's ink was smeared over machinery and thrown over the floors. It would seem to be the workings of a person of a younger age.

3. The following morning, Nelson Bros. found that approx. \$95.00 was taken from an office in the cannery. The amount was in silver change. A few younger boys had been seen around the cannery by two employees of the company over the week-end and had been told to stay away from the cannery. The Identification Branch at Pr. Rupert Sub/Div. was called to attend the scene of the theft, while inquiries were conducted at the Port Edward School.

4. The boys that were seen around the cannery be employees of Nelson Bros. were questioned and the names under the et al were found to be responsible for the B.E.&T. The c/n was the ringleader of the group. The following boys were part of the gang, but did not go inside the cannery, but shared in the money:



1. 1:30 PM 21-8-60, [redacted] The Smiles Cafe, Prince Rupert, BC advised this Detachment that the cafe had been broken into by unknown persons. Entry was gained by smashing a window in the South side of the building by throwing four rocks through it. Two plates of pie were knocked on the floor when the offence occurred. The following articles were stolen from the cafe. 10 packages of Sportsman cigarettes, 6 packages of Player's cigarettes, two boxes of 'Moir's' assorted fruit candy, and 100 pennies taken from the cash register. Total value \$9.46
2. The lights were on in The Cafe at the time the offence occurred. The front door window was smashed also. There was approximately \$10.00 dollars worth of property destroyed, in the broken glass.
3. The scene was examined by Cst. W.F. Rayson, pieces of glass found at the scene appeared to have fingerprints on them left by the culprit involved.
4. Cpl. E. Bonderud, Prince Rupert Sub/Division advised this Detachment that he had received information from a confidential source that the captionally noted Juvenile had been responsible for the offence.

Last Friday we came into Prince Rupert, BC and tied up at The Standard Oil Wharf. I was to the show Friday night the 19-8-60, I stayed at The Friendship House Friday night and went back to the boat Saturday in the afternoon. I also went to the Matinee Saturday afternoon. About 9:00 PM I met [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] from [REDACTED]. We chipped in and got an unknown man to buy us a bottle of rum. [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] years old, [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] years old. We were drinking in the Bathroom of the Dex Cafe and in The Bathroom of the Poolroom. We had a Mickey a piece. I left them at about 11:00 PM they went home, [REDACTED] took the bus to Port Edward and [REDACTED] went back on the boat, The Great Northern, [REDACTED] is the skipper on the Boat. About that time between 11:30 PM and 12 MIDNIGHT on 20-8-60 I then went down to SMILES CAFE I broke the window on the South side of the building and crawled into the Cafe. I then put packages of cigarettes candy into my pockets, I then took all the pennies out of the cash register and put them also in my pocket. The lights were on in the Cafe, I did not take anything else. I was in the Cafe for about ten minutes. I left by the window I then went down to the boat [REDACTED]. I went home on the [REDACTED] with my Uncle, [REDACTED]. I did not hide the cigarettes on the boat but kept them in my pockets. The boat went back at about 4:00 AM in the morning. The [REDACTED] returned after the show. I don't remember what I did with the Candy I had about 7 packages of cigarettes when I got to the boat. I don't remember where I left the rest of the cigarettes. They did not ask me any questions when I got on the boat. If I am released to the custody of the skipper on the boat I will obey his orders and advice, and will not be seen hanging around Skiff Row area in Prince Rupert, and will not drink any more until I am 21 years of age and can go in the Beer Parlour. I will appear in court with my guardian next Saturday at 10:30 AM in Prince Rupert. I will make restitution to The Smiles Cafe for the amount of damage I did breaking in and also for the goods that I stole.

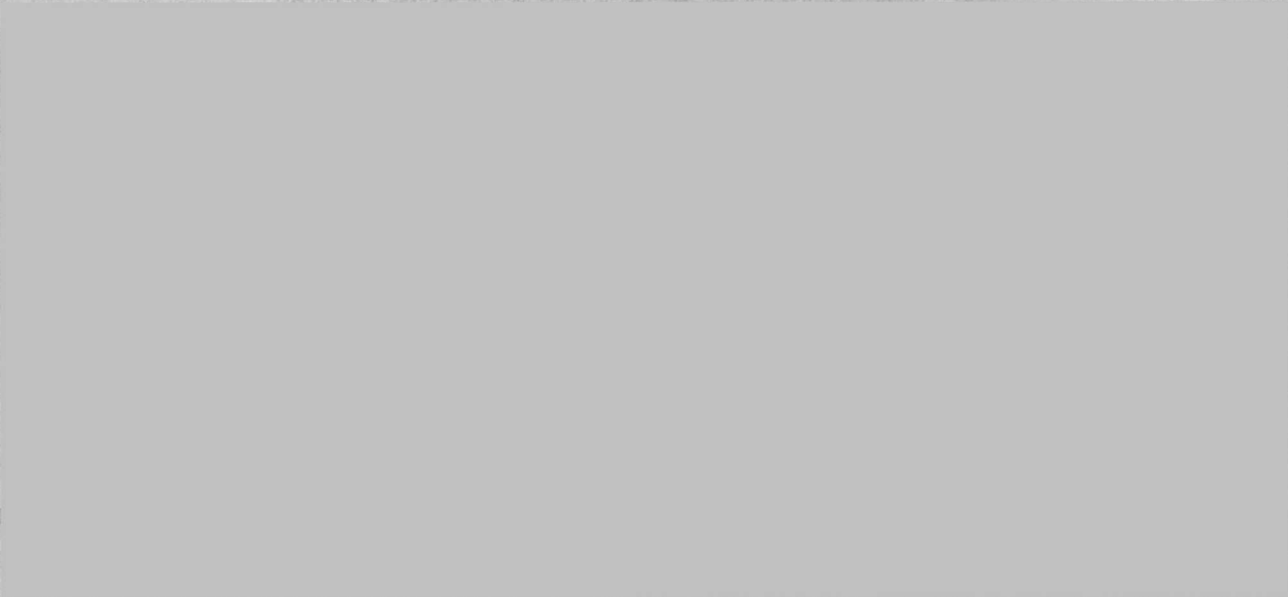

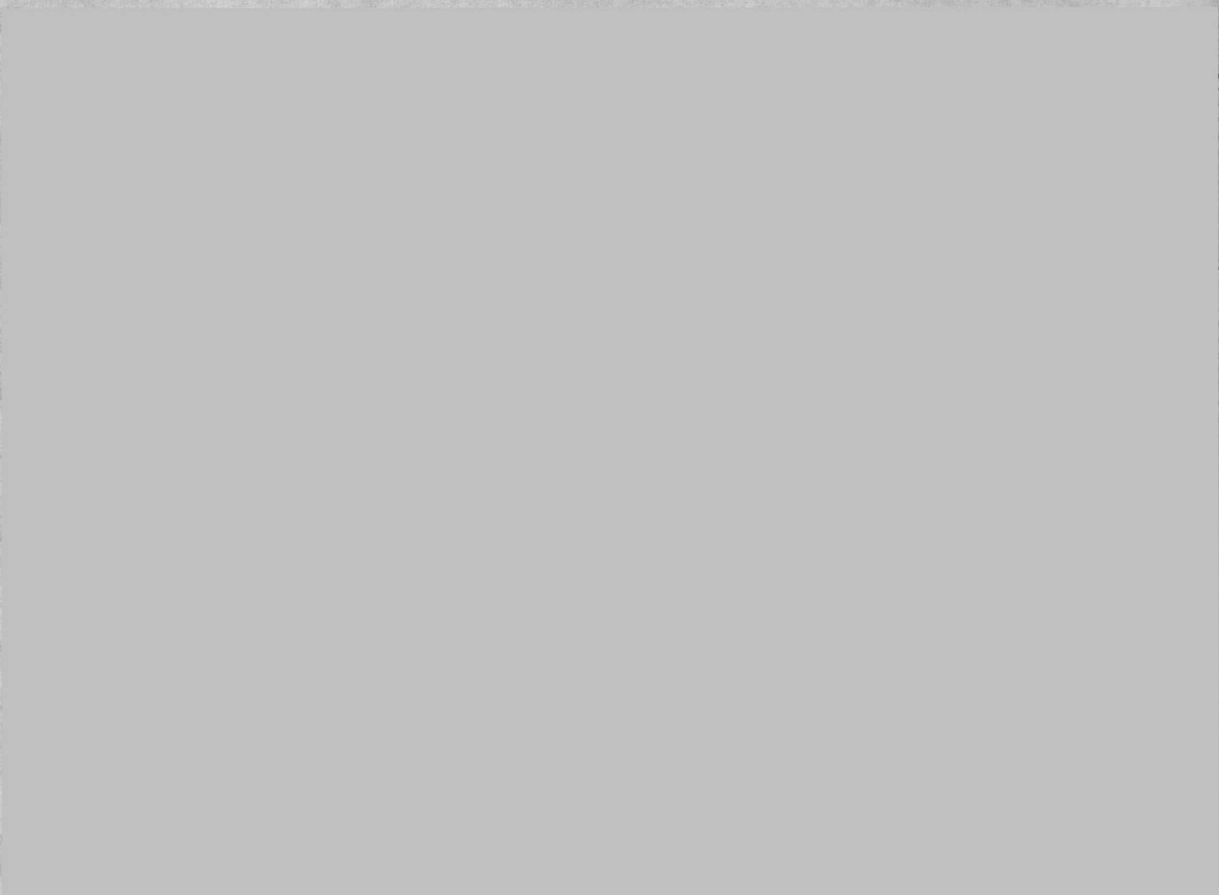

EXTRACT SOCIAL SERVICES

The need of increased service for reserve families in trouble, and assistance to those Indian families and individuals recently moved into non-Indian communities is becoming more apparent. During recent months several teen-age Indians, especially girls, have got into trouble in Prince Rupert and have been sent down to reform school, or otherwise placed under control. Others continue to drift in and out of the town. In following up these cases it is found that usually the youngsters leave home because of some trouble between parents, or between the parents and the child, which might have been overcome or improved upon if the services of a competent worker with the necessary time had been available in the Agency. Some of these problem cases are coming from the school areas; young people are leaving before they have reached a satisfactory grade level, not realising that this lack may be a permanent deterrent to their securing suitable employment in the future. We already have so many young men and women who have failed to go beyond Grade 5, 6 or 7, and who are now facing an insurmountable problem in finding employment, that it seems strongly indicated everything possible should be done to get at the root of the trouble, and work towards keeping these young people in school until they qualify for vocational training, or other training suited to their capacities. Through the work of a trained social worker with sufficient time to devote to the job, worthwhile results could be obtained.

We are unsuccessful in obtaining the help of the Provincial Social Welfare Department workers because they are already swamped with work, and cannot, therefore, devote enough time to the problems on Indian Reserves. In such large villages as Port Simpson, (Band population 905) there is a heavy incidence of juvenile misbehaviour resulting from lack of parental interest, or ability to cope with the problem, and much concentrated work is necessary to correct the defect. It would appear that only with the combined effort of social workers, school officials, and Agency officials, and Church workers, can any improvement be effected.

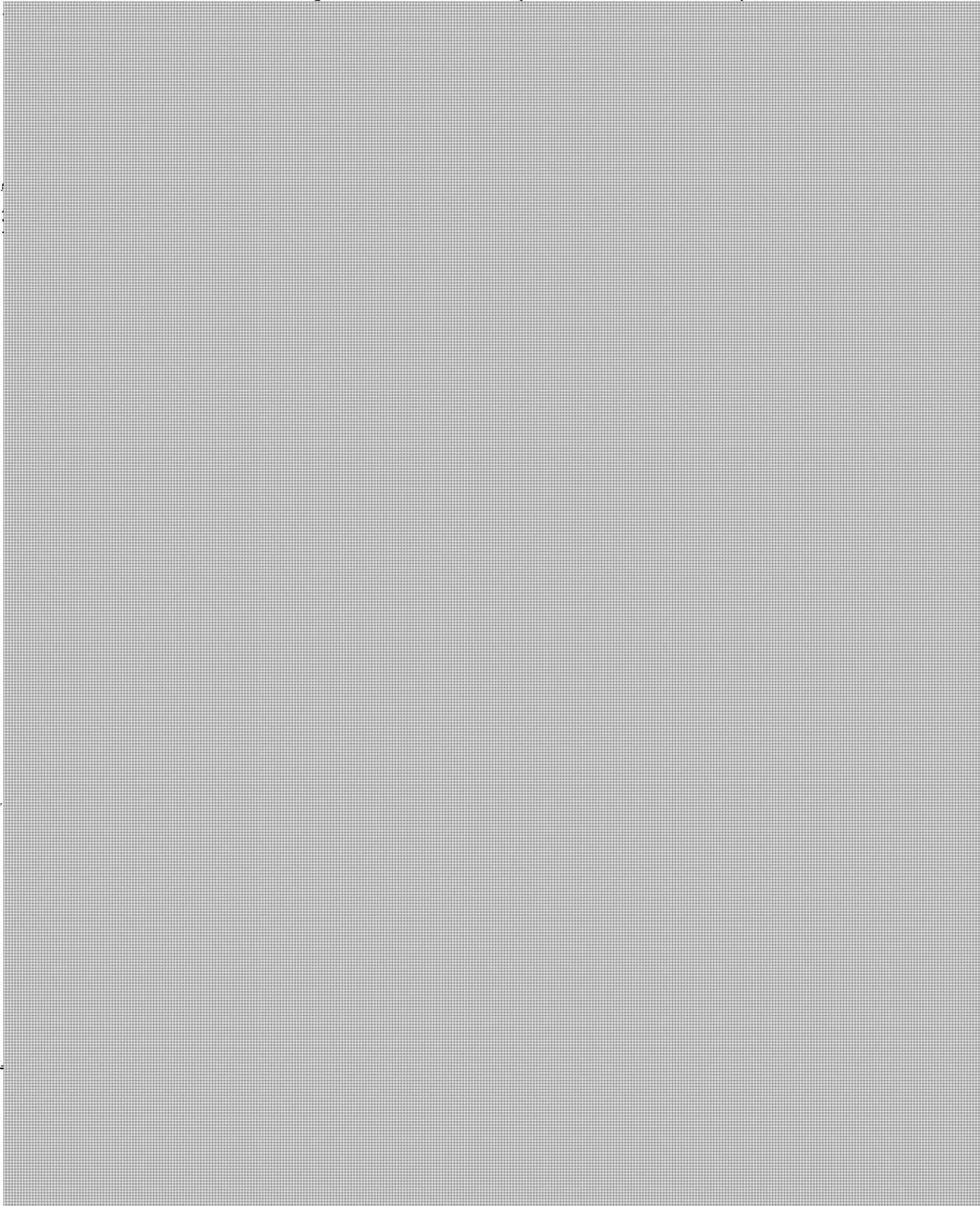

A copy of your petition together with your letter of July 6, 1959 has been received at this office and is hereby acknowledged.

As the original of the petition has presumably gone to the Department at Ottawa, you will likely be receiving a direct reply from Branch Headquarters.

The petition and letter has been carefully studied and knowing the Sechelt Band over a period of years, I find it very difficult to accept that the petition represents the minds and thinking of the Indian people as a whole. I just cannot believe that a large group of fathers and mothers can so easily admit that their village, its many fine homes and its beautiful church has become a centre of juvenile crime and delinquency and that the parents are defeated to the extent that instead of keeping their children as the joy and pride of their homes, want to turn over the care of their children to the Government. Only recently we read of the joy of the Doukabor parents in the interior at securing the release of their children from a residential school when they finally realized that to have their children at home as they so greatly desired, they must and would accept the responsibility of being good parents to them and seeing they attended the day school adjacent to their homes.


It is against the best interests of children to educate them, or attempt to educate them, away from the home

setting. Education is a process in which the home, the school and the church all play major parts and lucky is the child in whose all round development and training all three of these factors are present and working.

Residential Schools are not intended as havens for delinquents and it will be a sad day when they are used for such purposes. Residential Schools are for the orphan or part orphan; for the underprivileged child and the child without a home. Let us keep them that way. In the meantime, it is your duty as Chief and that of your Councillors to convince your people that major responsibility for the character of children lies in a Christian home and that parents cannot dodge that responsibility by just putting their children in other people's care. To do this is to stand judged by your children as unworthy parents. I for one do not believe that the Sechelt people are unworthy parents of their children, or that the children as a group are delinquent or bad.

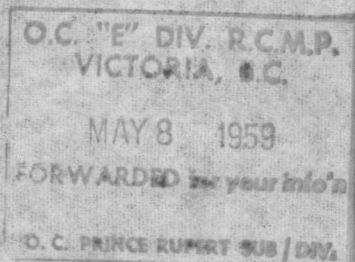

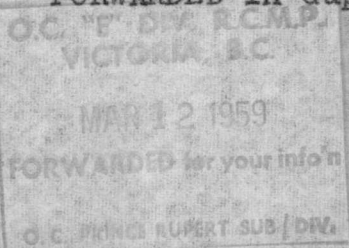

1. (CONT FROM PAGE ONE) AREA FAILED TO BRING any results. There was no indication as to where the girl might have gone.

2. On 30-8-57 the father reported to this office that he had located the two persons and that they were here at PORT EDWARD at the present time. On going to the net loff floats [redacted] and the girl were located on the boat "[redacted]". [redacted] was brought to this office, interviewed and detained. The girl was interviewed later this same date and a statement obtained from her.

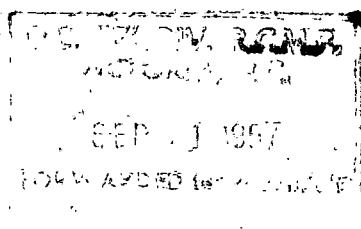
3. It was learned through the interviews that these two persons had been up to the NASS RIVER fishing from the 26th to the 30th, at which time they were returning to North Pacific Cannery. Just off Inverness Cannery the father of the girl saw the boat operated by [redacted] and checked it and found his daughter on the boat. He then took the [redacted] boat in tow and brought them to PORT EDWARD, and this was when [redacted] advised this office that he had located them. It was also learned that the two young persons were the only occupants of the boat when out on the fishing grounds and that they had had sexual intercourse four times between Tuesday and Thursday.

4. It will be noted that the penalty in this case is not severe and the Judge in making his decision did not see fit to impose a heavier penalty because of the low mentality of the two involved and the girl, being [redacted] years, born [redacted] had actively taken part in the affair without force of any kind being used. It is also because of the mentality of the girl that no action is being taken against her. It is felt that nothing would be gained by taking action in that regard and is, apparently, the first time the girl has been in any sort of trouble with the police.

5. [redacted] originally appeared in Court on 31-8-57 but was remanded to 5-9-57 when he failed to enter a plea and a plea of "NOT GUILTY" was entered at that time by the Judge, on his behalf. When appearing again before the Court on 5-9-57, he entered the noted plea of "GUILTY" and the charge was disposed of.

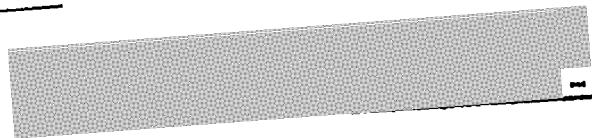

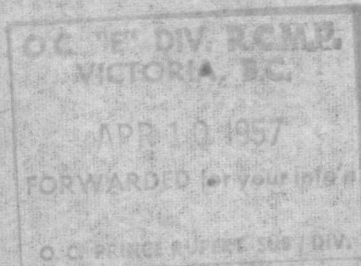

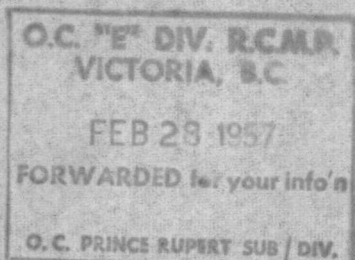

JUVENILE DELINQUENCY/PORT SIMPSON:

Further evidence of lawlessness has been seen during the past spring and summer at Port Simpson. Reports received from the contractor who lived for five months at Port Simpson while building the new school, reveal a situation which, if it continues to go unchecked, will produce a generation of irresponsible young people who have little idea of proper behaviour outside the school. With little constructive activity during evenings, and hardly any parental control, many of the youngsters are running wild after dark and getting into trouble of various kinds. This office has been pressing for police supervision for several years, but with no apparent success. Port Simpson is a village of over 600 people and deserves more police protection than the usual non-Indian community of comparable size, yet has none. An ideal arrangement would be the establishment of an R. C. M. P. detachment there, staffed with an officer whose duties consisted of both regular police work, and the more important work of giving some leadership to the youth of the village.

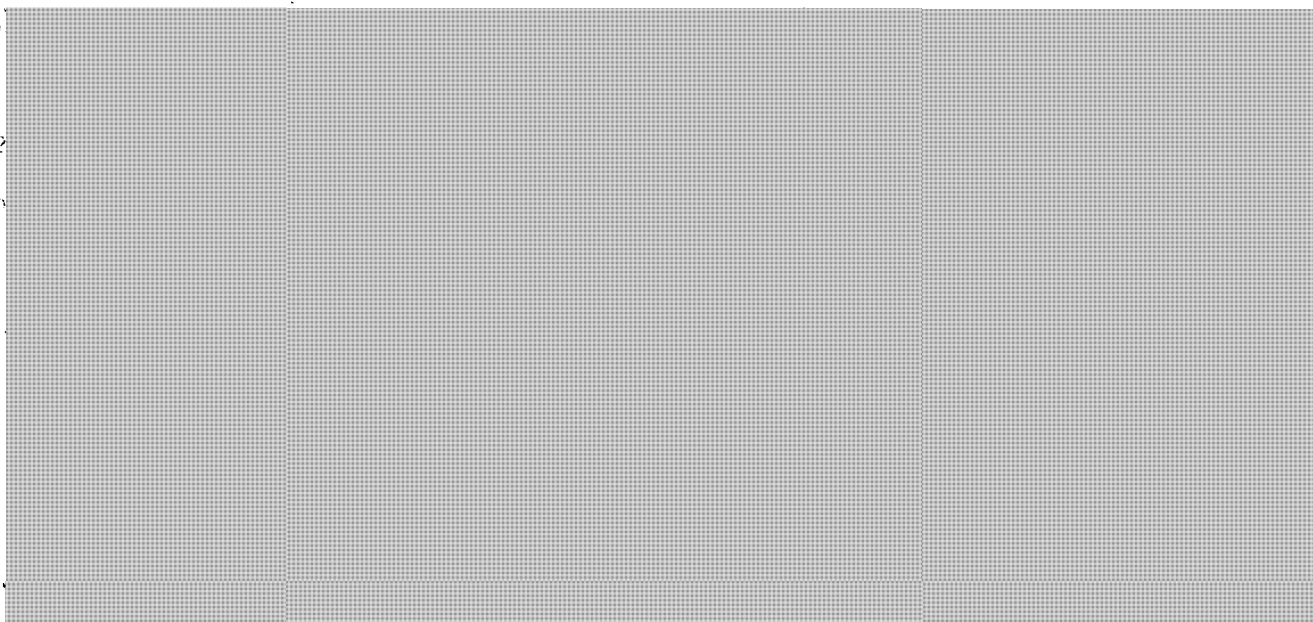

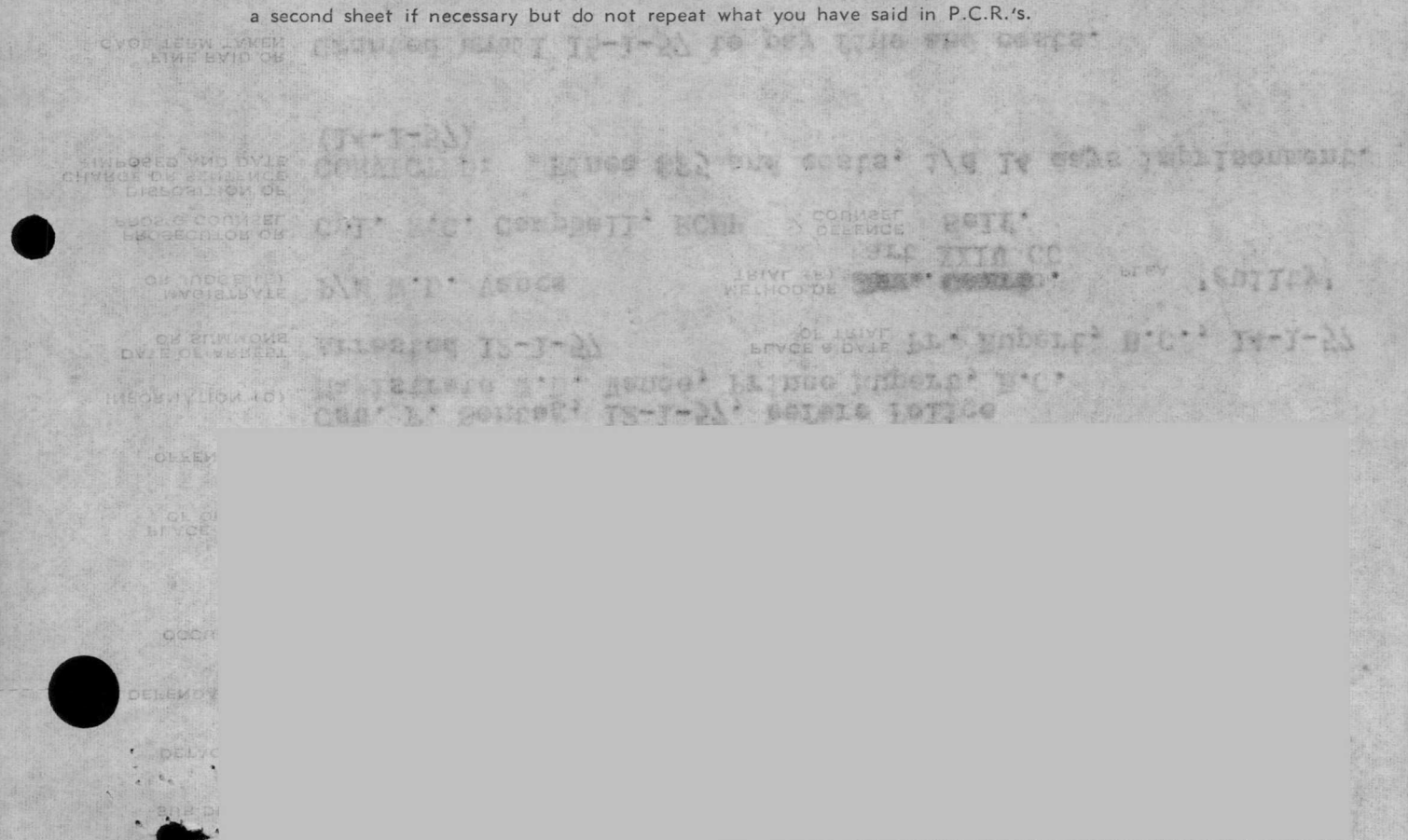

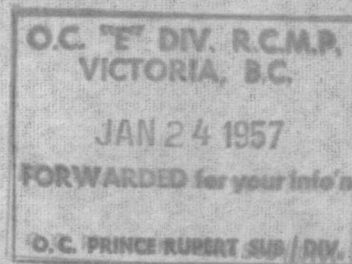

Superintendent reported to Council that R.C.M.P. have been asked to take action, and he will bring this to their attention again immediately.
