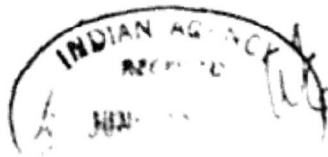

(variously spelled Tawpesin, Tawpsin, Tawpsin and Tawpsin).
112 Husky Lake Band was allotted the South 1/2 of Section 17, Township 47, Range 7,
West of the 3rd Meridian, by Band Council Resolution, dated March 7, 1946, which
listed sixteen allotments. This was never formally approved. The original is on
file hereunder.

On the basis of this allotment Alexander Tawpesin was given a 7.0-acre grant which was
formally approved May 23, 1946. During the period of December 1946 to May 1950, he expended
the sum of \$835.00 in brushing, breaking, and double discing his land until he had broken
around 125 acres, a good portion of which he had sowed to wheat in 1947. The Agency report
of February 1950 indicated that Tawpesin had threshed 350 bushels of wheat the previous fall
but that his crops were not good due to the dry weather prevailing in the area. The follow-
ing indicates that he purchased six head of cattle, four head of horses, a barbed wire and
stapler, a hay rake, mower, disc harrow, and other material and equipment commensurate
with farming operations. Successive crop failures due to adverse weather conditions forced
Tawpesin to request permission to lease his land to a non-Indian farmer to obtain funds with
which to maintain his family and pay certain debts. At that time he was married and had six
children. His land was leased for a period of seven years, expiring on December 31, 1959,
on a 1/4 acre share basis. His revenues therefrom for the entire period was \$1071.48. By
Resolution of Council dated October 12, 1959, leases expiring in 1959 were not to be renewed
to white men. The land was subject to being farmed either by individual owners or Indian
farmers.

Alexander Tawpesin died August 24, 1961, but his death was not reported until August
Membership Return of 1964. By Res. No. dated June 15, 1964, the Council requested that the
land be leased to one Arnold Wells of L. A., Saskatchewan, in the name of Mrs. Clara
Tawpesin, who was the widow of Alexander Tawpesin. Where Mrs. Wells was duly issued
on a 1/3 acre share basis. Proceeds of the lease were paid to Clara until her death on
January 19, 1965. On her death Clara left her surviving heirs at law and next of kin
eight children four of whom are still minors, the youngest being, born September 11, 1950.

The lease is as per rental and the Land Council wish the lease renewed with the revenue therefrom, according to the Regional Director for Bushbuckridge, being placed in Land Fund. This seems to me most inequitable in view of (1) the original allotment of 1946, (2) the equity which this family has in the property, (3) the fact that the Tshepo's house is constructed on the land, and (4) the leasing in 1962 of this farm property in the name of Clara Tshepo.

Could you, therefore, if you concur in this recommendation, by endorsing your approval hereto recognize that the late Alexander Tshepo was in lawful possession of the 2 1/2-acre 7-1-62. In accordance with Land Council Resolution dated March 7, 1966.

The Veterans' Land Act and Regulations thereunder authorize the Indian Affairs Branch to make advances to a veteran settled on an Indian reserve, for improvements and purchase of chattels, title to and right of possession of which remain in the name of the Director. These advances become a grant conditional upon the veteran complying with the terms of his agreement with the Branch for a period of ten consecutive years.

It is noted that in the case of the above named veteran, the required ten year period has now expired. This is to inform you that this letter may be retained by you, with a copy for the veteran, as formal evidence that the Director has transferred clear title to the livestock and chattels which have been supplied under the Veterans' Land Act.

Therefore, please be advised that all livestock and chattels purchased through the proceeds of the Veterans' Land Act grant are now considered to be the personal property of the above mentioned veteran.

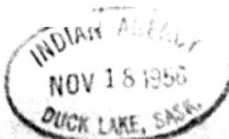

The ten year probationary period with respect to the Veterans' Land Act grant made to the above noted veteran will expire on June 28, 1956.

On that date the chattels purchased for him from the proceeds of the grant will be released to the veteran by the Director.

When the chattels are released the settlement of the veteran will have been completed and any unexpended portion of the grant will no longer be available to him, nor will an application for a Supplementary Grant be accepted.

The total of the grant approved for this veteran was, \$2,340.00.... the expenditures to date total, \$2,296.88 leaving an unexpended balance of ..\$43.12

It is important that the veteran's settlement be reviewed and discussed with him, so that any required Supplementary Application may be submitted and all necessary expenditures completed before June 28, 1956.

Supplementary Applications should not be submitted, nor additional expenditures made, unless they are justified by the effort the veteran has made in re-establishing himself, or are necessary to complete his settlement.

You were recently informed by the Director that various Indian veterans in your Agency had fulfilled the conditions upon which their V.L.A. grants were made.

From a review of the various files involved to determine whether veterans should be recognized as having lawful possession of land there appears to be room for doubt in some cases as to the intent of Band Councils at the time lands were "allotted". This doubt exists mainly in connection with Reserves where there are no individual land holdings. Accordingly, before issuing any evidence of ownership of land, it is desired to ascertain whether you are aware of any objection. If doubt exists as to the feeling of the Band Council, the matter should be discussed with the Council.
