Sir, in July, 1962 Commodore Welland requested approval to bring the Royal Naval Liaison Officers' regular attendance at meetings of Naval Staff to an end. His reasons for requesting this are given in reference (b). This request was approved by VCNS.

2. In lieu of such attendance it was proposed that DNOR arrange a weekly briefing for the RNLO by officers of Director status to which the US Naval Attache would also be invited. This procedure was brought into force although from its inception it was agreed that a fortnightly briefing would be more appropriate.

3. After three such briefings the practice was allowed to lapse by default for the following reasons:

- (a) The choice of suitable agenda items was found to be awkward for much the same reasons which led to Cmdre Welland's request that the RNLO no longer attend meetings of Naval Staff.
- (b) Difficulty was experienced in providing sufficient information on a fortnightly basis to justify a briefing being held.
- (c) Difficulties encountered in establishing briefings on a regular basis due to the absence from Ottawa of either one or the other of the officers concerned. In this regard it was considered that briefing by officers of Director status was not justified for members of the staff of the RNLO or US Naval Attache. These officers are in any case in constant touch with us in the normal course of their liaison duties.

4. Experience has in fact shown that the value of RN/USN briefings is very much open to doubt on all sides. It was accordingly hoped that they would be allowed to gracefully lapse. I would be reluctant therefore to reinstate them on a formal basis but, subject to your approval, would prefer rather that I may contact Captain Martin personally in order to establish how best his needs may be met. I am sure that this can be done without recourse to a procedure which proved to be both cumbersome and largely unproductive.

3. DNOR is therefore to undertake the presentation of this briefing, assisted as necessary by appropriate specialists and on the general lines proposed by DNI in reference (b).

4. Both the RNLO and US Naval Attache have been informed of our decision and further intentions in this respect.


4. Should this prove unsatisfactory in any particular case, the Attache interested could either:

ATTENDANCE OF RN OFFICERS AT NAVAL STAFF MEETINGS

I would like to stop the practice of permitting the Royal Naval Liaison Officer and/or his staff officers attending Naval Staff Meetings. The reasons follow:

- (a) Staff itself is a forum where in-house problems are discussed. If outsiders attend we are reluctant to speak freely. Unless Staff can in fact be a forum where officers can argue and be contentious if necessary it loses a great deal of its point.
- (b) There are certain matters which Staff discuss that should be for Canadian Eyes Only. Examples:
 - (i) the pros and cons of British versus American equipment.
 - (ii) matters nuclear.
- (c) There is every likelihood that the RNLO may comment, on particular matters, direct to Admiralty, who in turn, might raise the subjects with CANAVERTIT assuming that he had been informed by us: Such might not have been the case as we may not have seen it necessary to inform him.
- (d) It can be argued that to invite the RNLO to attend Staff, and not the USN Attache, is a slight on the latter observing that Canada is at least as deeply involved with defence matters with the US as with Britain.

2. In view of the above I recommend that now is an appropriate time to stop the attendance at Staff of the RNLO: I am just taking over the chairmanship and a change in approach could be attributed to a whim of mine as opposed to a change of policy. In fact this may be an appropriate light to put on a change at the present time.

3. In order that the RNLO and the US Naval Attache are able to do their work properly I suggest that once a week DNOR conduct a briefing, at which time the two above-mentioned officers and their staffs, if desired by them, attend. For the briefing DNOR could cull up assistance from DNI, CNTS, etc.

4. If this suggestion is agreeable I will put off the RNLO for the Staff Meeting on Wednesday 1 August and hope, in the interval, before 8 August, it will be possible to arrange the briefing sessions in lieu.
