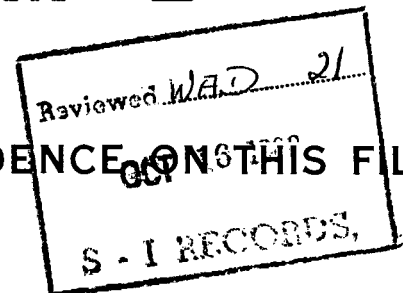

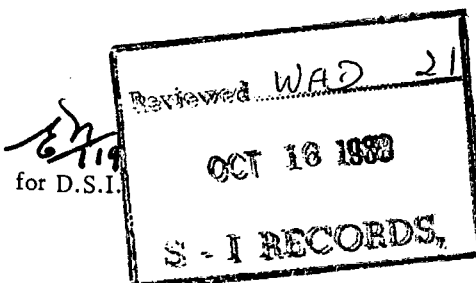

## INFORMATION:

1. [REDACTED]  
the Association of United Ukrainian Canadians in the Glace Bay N.S. area does not exist anymore. [REDACTED] it died out over 5 or 6 years ago and their hasn't been a meeting or gathering of any kind since that time.
2. There may be 3 or 4 people in the area who still subscribe to the Ukrainian newspaper, but these are old people now and their only interest is in the language and cultural aspect. [REDACTED] there are 2 men in the Glace Bay area, who are interested in the political aspect and they are sympathetic to communism, but they too are old and don't really have any interest. These men are Mike SALYZYN [REDACTED] and Sam KAVLUK [REDACTED]
3. John EVASUK [REDACTED] was active in the AUUC also but lost interest several years ago, he subscribed to the paper Ukrainian Life (Ukrainske Zhitya) up until his death a few months ago. After his death his wife offered some of these papers to Mike SALYZYN [REDACTED] and he told her to throw them away because there wasn't anyone left who would bother with them or had any interest.
4. [REDACTED] during the past 7 or 8 years the AUUC has put on press campaigns to raise funds and get new subscribers. John EVASUK used to be responsible for raising the money and sending it in, but during the most recent ones individual subscribers were sent envelopes and asked to mail in their contributions individually.
5. [REDACTED] that none of the young people have any interest in the AUUC or it's papers and those that were active many years ago have lost interest and are slowly passing away.

One of the methods of raising funds, which is presently in use, is by selling raffle tickets on an article which they purchase locally. When these raffles are in progress one of the mentioned men will usually be found at #1 Gate of the Sydney Steel Plant, selling tickets to the steelworkers. Source does not know where the tickets are printed nor does he know who actually runs the raffle.

VII) The current total membership in the new district is 136

7. A number of persons took part in a general discussion based on the points raised. The first session adjourned for lunch.

8. The session resumed at 2 p.m. with a speech by William HARASYM. He discussed the Canadian Born problem. He wants to open English Speaking Branches in Lachine, Ville LaSalle and Pte. St. Charles. He said that the A.U.U. Montreal English Speaking Branch was doing very well with 11 members. Now that Zinowiy NYKOLYSHYN and his wife moved in Montreal from Winnipeg, Man., this membership will be 13. He urged all present to work hard to build up English Speaking Branches.

9. Anton KACHMAR, believed to have been the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, announced that the Committee had met and were in agreement to recommend the resolutions as outlined by ROSHKO. The resolutions were then adopted by the Convention.

10. Dmytro KOSTASZEC of the Credentials Committee reported that there were 34 Branch delegates and 12 official guests present at the Convention.

11. Peter PROKOP stated that the changes made in the District, i.e. reducing the territory and changing from a Provincial Committee to a District Committee should make it much easier to carry out organizational work, and make efforts in the cultural and educational fields more effective.
